A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MENTAL HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that according to a 2021 Center for Disease Control and Prevention analysis, nearly forty 2 3 per cent of high school students reported experiencing poor 4 mental health during the coronavirus disease 2019 pandemic and 5 forty-four per cent reported persistent feelings of sadness or hopelessness in the last year. Significant investments in 6 7 mental health are required to reverse these trends and to 8 address the eroding mental wellbeing of adolescents.

9 The YMCA offers a number of services that promote health 10 and well-being. The YMCA of Honolulu Youth Wellness Program for 11 Mental Health proposes to engage four thousand five hundred 12 youth between the ages of twelve and eighteen in therapeutic 13 activities to help develop self-awareness, self-esteem, 14 appropriate coping mechanisms, and stress management tools to 15 address their mental health and wellness needs, and program 16 activities would be conducted at YMCA locations and venues where 17 services are easily accessible to the community and would take

2	proposes to:	
3	(1)	Enable the YMCA to build and strengthen its
4		organizational capacity and expand its outreach
5		services;
6	(2)	Assist the YMCA in increasing the skills and knowledge
7		required to provide wellness programs for mental
8		health to all communities, especially those with the
9		greatest needs, as well as collect the necessary data
10		to demonstrate the impact of its programs; and
11	(3)	Enable the YMCA to maximize resources through
12		collaborative partnerships with businesses and
13		agencies in the fields of mental health and substance
14		abuse on a statewide basis.
15	Acco	rdingly, the purpose of this Act is to appropriate
16	funds to	the YMCA of Honolulu as a grant-in-aid for the
17	development and statewide implementation of the Youth Wellness	
18	Program for Mental Health.	
19	SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general	
20	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$2,7000,000 or so	
21	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and



This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2023.
