RELATING TO CHILD WELFARE SERVICES.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 2. (a) There is established within the department
  of human services for administrative purposes a Malama Ohana
  working group to seek, design, and recommend transformative
  changes to the State's existing child welfare system.
- 14 (b) The Malama Ohana working group shall consist of
  15 members from the following governmental entities, and members
  16 from the following private entities and constituencies who shall
  17 be invited to voluntarily participate, as follows;

(1)	The executive director of Effective Planning and
	Innovative Communication, Inc., doing business as
	EPIC `Ohana, or the executive director's designee, who
	shall be requested to serve as co-chair of the working
	group;
(2)	The chief executive officer of Hale Kipa, Inc., or the
	chief executive's designee, who shall be requested to
	serve as co-chair of the working group;
(3)	Four members of Nā Kama a Hāloa;
(4)	Two members from each of the following constituencies,
	as identified by Nā Kama a Hāloa;:
	(A) Former foster youth;
	(B) Birth parents who were involved in the child
	welfare system, specifically with the department
	of human services' child welfare services branch;
	(C) Licensed resource caregivers; and
	(D) Kinship resource caregivers;
(5)	The director of human services, or the director's
	designee;

14	(c)	The Malama Ohana working group shall develop
15	recommend	ations to establish a child welfare system that is
16	trauma-in	formed, sustains a community-based partnership, and
17	responsiv	e to the needs of children and families in the child
18	welfare s	ystem and among the larger community. In carrying out
19	its purpo	se, the working group shall:
20	(1)	Conduct listening sessions throughout the State and
21		with affected constituencies.

1	(2)	Conduct meetings to brainstorm and develop concepts
2		for recommendations;
3	(3)	Develop recommendations on ways to better coordinate
4		and improve the protection and well-being of children
5		and families in the child welfare system;
6	(4)	Identify training and best practices, assessment
7		criteria, and ways to sustain an effective workforce
8		within the department of human services' child welfare
9		services branch;
10	(5)	Identify training and best practices, assessment
11		criteria, and ways to sustain an effective workforce
12		within the larger circle of community agencies serving
13		the child welfare system;
14	(6)	Identify best practices, including Native Hawaiian
15		cultural practices, in providing assistance to
16		children and youth who were involved in the child
17		welfare system and their families;
18	(7)	Identify other cultural practices that build wellness
19		and resilience in communities and improve
20		collaboration between communities and the child
21		welfare services branch; and

- 1 (8) Collaborate with the trauma-informed care task force,
  2 and where appropriate, conduct joint listening
  3 sessions or design sessions for the purpose of
  4 reforming the child welfare system.
  5 (d) Members of the Malama Ohana working group shall serve
  6 without compensation but shall be reimbursed for reasonable
- 7 expenses necessary for the performance of their duties,
- 8 including travel expenses. No member of the working group shall
- 9 be subject to chapter 84, Hawaii Revised Statutes, solely
- 10 because of the member's participation in the working group.
- 11 (e) The department of human services may contract with an
- 12 administrative facilitator to provide necessary support for the
- 13 Malama Ohana working group in carrying out its activities,
- 14 including preparation of the report required pursuant to
- 15 subsection (f), without regard to chapter 103D, Hawaii Revised
- 16 Statutes.
- 17 (f) The Malama Ohana working group shall submit a report
- 18 of its findings and recommendations, including any proposed
- 19 legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior
- 20 to the convening of the regular session of 2025.

3	SECT	ION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
4	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
5	much ther	eof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and
6	the same	sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
7	year 2024	-2025 for the procurement of contracted services to
8	provide a	dditional support and resources to families receiving
9	benefits	from the State's adoption assistance program and
10	permanenc	y assistance program, for the purposes of assisting
11	with fami	ly strengthening and the maintenance of a safe home
12	environme	nt for adopted children; provided that:
13	(1)	\$ shall be expended for the development and
14		maintenance of necessary information technology
15		systems, including the establishment of two full time
16		equivalent (2.0 FTE) positions;
17	(2)	\$ shall be expended to increase compensation
18		to fill vacancies and retain employees in existing
19		child welfare services branch investigator, case
20		manager, and social worker positions; provided that
21		any increase in compensation shall be subject to

1		corrective bargarning with the objective of
2		expeditiously filling all vacancies;
3	(3)	\$ shall be expended for the department of
4		human services to contract with a third party for
5		enhanced permanency support services, including
6		additional training for resource caregivers, wellness
7		visits within a year of adoption or guardianship of
8		children formerly in foster care, respite care, and
9		enhanced supportive services to assist with family
10		strengthening and maintenance of a safe home
11		environment for adopted children;
12	(4)	\$ shall be expended for the establishment of
13		one full time equivalent (1.0 FTE) planner or project
14		specialist position to administer and monitor
15		additional service contracts and assist with
16		additional service coordination; and
17	(5)	\$ shall be expended for the Malama Ohana
18		working group established pursuant to section 2 of
19		this Act, including for the department of human
20		services to contract with an administrative

1	facilitator to provide necessary support for the
2	working group in carrying out its activities.
3	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
4	of human services for the purposes of this Act.
5	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
6	provided that section 3 of this Act shall take effect on July 1,
7	2023.
