

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROTECTING AGENCY POSITIONS FROM ELIMINATION REQUIREMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. This Act shall be known as the "Protecting
- 2 Agency Positions from Elimination Requirement Act" or "PAPER
- 3 Act".
- 4 SECTION 2. The legislature finds that the department of
- 5 human services and department of health are grossly
- 6 understaffed. Since the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic, both
- 7 departments have experienced an employee shortfall of thirty per
- 8 cent of state-funded positions. During this same period, there
- 9 has also been a vast increase in the number of residents who
- 10 need health and human services. The department of human
- 11 services and department of health are doing their best to
- 12 provide services and recruit new employees. However, health
- 13 care and program administrators are burned out and these
- 14 positions are demanding and difficult to fill. If the
- 15 legislature were to eliminate these budgeted positions and any

- 1 associated positions, these important departments would not be
- 2 able to function.
- 3 The purpose of this Act is to prohibit the elimination of
- 4 funding for vacant positions in the department of human services
- 5 and department of health for five years, or until the director
- 6 of human services or director of health, as applicable, requests
- 7 that the positions be eliminated, whichever occurs first.
- 8 SECTION 3. Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary,
- 9 funding for vacant positions in the department of human services
- 10 and department of health shall not be eliminated for five years,
- 11 or until the director of human services or director of health,
- 12 as applicable, requests that the positions be eliminated,
- 13 whichever occurs first.
- 14 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
