

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ADVANCED PRACTICE REGISTERED NURSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that advanced practice 2 registered nurses provide a wide variety of health care services 3 to people across the State. The legislature further finds that 4 existing law requires each hospital within the State to allow 5 advanced practice registered nurses to practice at the hospital 6 within the full scope of their authorized practice, including 7 practice as primary care providers. Advanced practice 8 registered nurses are also recognized as participating primary 9 care providers for insurance purposes under the State's 10 insurance code. 11 The legislature also finds that, despite these facts, 12 certain sections of existing law have not been amended to 13 include advanced practice registered nurses in areas concerning 14 disability determinations for purposes of income tax laws and 15 mental health directives. Accordingly, these statutes should be 16 expanded to authorize increased participation by advanced

practice registered nurses and recognize appropriately trained

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- 2 providers that they are. Authorizing increased participation by
- 3 advanced practice registered nurses in certain circumstances
- 4 will further enable improved access to health care services,
- 5 expedite the processing of paperwork, and provide optimal care
- 6 at the initial point of access for Hawaii patients, especially
- 7 in rural and medically underserved areas.
- 8 The purpose of this Act is to improve patient access to
- 9 medical care and services by:
- 10 (1) Authorizing advanced practice registered nurses to
- 11 certify whether a person is totally disabled under the
- income tax code;
- 13 (2) Adding advanced practice registered nurses as primary
- 14 providers in advance mental health care directives;
- 15 and
- 16 (3) Authorizing advanced practice registered nurses to
- 17 make capacity determinations for purposes of advance
- mental health care directives.
- 19 SECTION 2. Section 235-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 20 amended by amending the definition of "person totally disabled"
- 21 to read as follows:

2	and perman	mently disabled, either physically or mentally, which			
3	results in	n the person's inability to engage in any substantial			
4	gainful b	usiness or occupation.			
5	The o	disability shall be certified to by a:			
6	(1)	Physician or osteopathic physician licensed under			
7		chapter 453[+] or an advanced practice registered			
8		nurse licensed under chapter 457;			
9	(2)	Qualified out-of-state physician or advanced practice			
10		registered nurse who is currently licensed to practice			
11		in the state in which the physician or advanced			
12		<pre>practice registered nurse resides; or</pre>			
13	(3)	Commissioned medical officer in the United States			
14		Army, Navy, Marine Corps, or Public Health Service,			
15		engaged in the discharge of the officer's official			
16		duty.			
17	Certifica	tion shall be on forms prescribed by the department of			
18	taxation.	n			
19	SECT	ION 3. Section 327G-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
20	amended a	s follows:			

- 1 1. By adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted
- 2 and to read:
- 3 ""Advanced practice registered nurse" means a person
- 4 <u>licensed as an advanced practice registered nurse pursuant to</u>
- 5 chapter 457."
- 6 2. By amending the definition of "primary physician" to
- 7 read:
- 8 ""Primary [physician"] provider" means a physician or
- 9 advanced practice registered nurse designated by a principal or
- 10 the principal's agent or guardian to have primary responsibility
- 11 for the principal's health care, including mental health care
- 12 or, in the absence of a designation or if the designated
- 13 physician or advanced practice registered nurse is not
- 14 reasonably available, a physician or advanced practice
- 15 registered nurse who undertakes the responsibility."
- 3. By amending the definition of "supervising health care
- 17 provider" to read:
- ""Supervising health care provider" means the primary
- 19 [physician] provider or the [physician's] primary provider's
- 20 designee, or the health care provider or the provider's designee

- 1 who has undertaken primary responsibility for a principal's
- 2 health care, that includes mental health care."
- 3 SECTION 4. Section 327G-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 4 amended by amending subsections (d) and (e) to read as follows:
- 5 "(d) For the purposes of this chapter, the determination
- 6 that a principal lacks capacity shall be made by the supervising
- 7 health care provider who is a physician or an advanced practice
- 8 registered nurse and one other physician, advanced practice
- 9 registered nurse, or licensed psychologist after both have
- 10 conducted an examination of the principal. Upon examination and
- 11 a joint determination that the principal lacks capacity, the
- 12 supervising health care provider shall promptly note the
- 13 determination in the principal's medical record, including the
- 14 facts and professional opinions that form the basis of the
- 15 determination, and shall promptly notify the agent that the
- 16 principal lacks capacity and that the advance mental health care
- 17 directive has been invoked.
- 18 (e) The determination that a principal has recovered
- 19 capacity shall be made by the supervising health care provider
- 20 who is a physician[+] or an advanced practice registered nurse.
- 21 The supervising health care provider shall promptly note the

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1	recovery of capacity in the principal's medical record, and					
2	shall promptly notify the agent that the principal has recovered					
3	capacity."					
4	SECTION 5. Section 327G-10, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is					
5	amended by amending subsection (e) to read as follows:					
6	"(e) A physician [or], a licensed psychologist, <u>or an</u>					
7	advanced practice registered nurse, who in good faith determines					
8	that the principal has or lacks capacity in accordance with this					
9	chapter to decide whether to invoke an advance mental health					
10	care directive, is not subject to criminal prosecution, civil					
11	liability, or professional disciplinary action for making and					
12	acting upon that determination."					
13	SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed					
14	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.					
15	SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Report Title:

Advanced Practice Registered Nurses; Persons Totally Disabled; Tax Code; Primary Providers; Capacity; Advance Mental Health Care Directives

Description:

Authorizes advanced practice registered nurses to certify whether a person is totally disabled under the income tax code. Adds advanced practice registered nurses as primary providers in advance mental health care directives. Authorizes advanced practice registered nurses to make capacity determinations for purposes of advance mental health care directives.

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
