A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO BURIAL COUNCILS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that delays in nominating
 and appointing, or reappointing, members to island burial
 councils may affect the ability of councils to function
 effectively. If a member's term expires and the member's
 reappointment is delayed or a successor is not timely appointed,
 the burial council may lack the quorum necessary to conduct
 business.

8 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to allow a burial 9 council member whose term has expired to continue in office as a 10 holdover member until the member's reappointment to a second 11 term is confirmed or a successor is nominated and appointed.

SECTION 2. Section 6E-43.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended to read as follows:

14 "§6E-43.5 Island burial councils; creation; appointment;
15 composition; duties. (a) There [are] shall be established
16 within the department five island burial councils, one each for
17 Hawai'i, Maui/Lāna'i, Moloka'i, O'ahu, and Kaua'i/Ni'ihau, to

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implement section 6E-43. Each council shall consist of nine 1 members, except the Moloka'i council, which shall consist of five 2 3 members. Each council shall consist of no more than three 4 representatives of development and large landowner interests; 5 provided that the Moloka'i council shall consist of no more than 6 one representative of development and large landowner interests. 7 The remaining council members shall represent the geographic regions identified in paragraphs (1) through (5). At all times, 8 9 at least two of the regional representatives of each council 10 shall have been appointed from a list of nominees submitted to 11 the governor by the office of Hawaiian affairs, as provided 12 under subsection (b). Each council shall include at least one 13 representative for each geographic region identified as follows: 14 (1)The Hawai'i council shall include the following 15 geographic regions: Kohala, Kona, Ka'ū, Puna, Hilo, 16 and Hāmākua; 17 (2) The Maui/Lāna'i council shall include the following 18 geographic regions: Honua'ula, Lahaina, Wailuku,

19 Makawao, Hāna, and Lāna'i;

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1	(3)	The Moloka'i council shall include the following
2		geographic regions: West Molokaʻi, Central Molokaʻi,
3		East Molokaʻi, and Kalawao;
4	(4)	The Oʻahu council shall include the following
5		geographic regions: Waiʻānae, 'Ewa, Kona, Koʻolaupoko,
6		Koʻolauloa, and Waialua; and
7	(5)	The Kauaʻi/Niʻihau council shall include the following
8		geographic regions: Waimea/Na Pali, Kōloa, Līhuʻe,
9		Kawaihau, Hanalei, and Niʻihau.
10	Regional	representatives shall be selected from the Hawaiian
11	community	on the basis of the representatives' understanding of
12	the cultu	re, history, burial beliefs, customs, and practices of
13	native Ha	waiians in the region they each represent.
14	(b)	Appointment of members to the councils shall be made
15	by the go	vernor, in accordance with section 26-34 and
16	subsection	n (a), from lists for each council submitted by the
17	departmen	t and the office of Hawaiian affairs. Lists to fill
18	vacancies	on the councils shall be submitted as follows:
19	(1)	For vacancies attributable to the expiration of terms,
20		the list shall be submitted on the first business day

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1	of December [prior to] <u>before</u> the expiration of the		
2	terms, except as provided in subsection (c); and		
3	(2) For a vacancy that occurs during a council		
4	representative's term, the list shall be submitted		
5	within thirty business days after the vacancy occurs,		
6	except as provided in subsection (c).		
7	(c) The department may submit any list to fill a vacancy		
8	up to fifteen days after the office of Hawaiian affairs submits		
9	its list for the same vacancy; provided that the failure of the		
10	department to submit any list by any relevant deadline or		
11	fifteen days after the office of Hawaiian affairs submits its		
12	list, whichever occurs later, shall be construed as a waiver of		
13	the department's right to submit a list.		
14	(d) Notwithstanding section 26-34(b) or any other law to		
15	the contrary, any council member whose term has expired may		
16	continue in office as a holdover member until the member's		
17	reappointment to a second term is confirmed or a successor is		
18	nominated and appointed; provided that a holdover member shall		
19	not hold office beyond the end of the fourth regular session of		
20	the legislature following the expiration of the member's term of		
21	office.		



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1 $\left[\frac{d}{d}\right]$ (e) The department, in consultation with the 2 councils, office of Hawaiian affairs, representatives of 3 development and large landowner interests, and appropriate Hawaiian organizations, such as Hui Malama I Na Kupuna O Hawai'i 4 5 Nei, shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 necessary to carry 6 out the purposes of this section. The council members shall 7 serve without compensation, but shall be reimbursed for 8 necessary expenses incurred during the performance of their 9 duties. The councils shall be a part of the department for 10 administrative purposes.

11 [(c)] (f) The councils shall hold meetings and acquire 12 information as they deem necessary and shall communicate their 13 findings and recommendations to the department. Notwithstanding 14 section 92-3, whenever the location and description of burial 15 sites are under consideration, the councils may hold closed 16 meetings. A majority of all members to which each council is 17 entitled shall constitute a quorum to do business. Concurrence 18 of a majority of the members present at a meeting shall be 19 necessary to make any action of a council valid.

20 [(f)] (g) Department records relating to the location and
21 description of historic sites, including burial sites, if deemed

2	board, shall be confidential.		
3	[(g)]	(h) The councils shall:	
4	(1)	Determine the preservation or relocation of previously	
5		identified native Hawaiian burial sites;	
6	(2)	Assist the department in the inventory and	
7		identification of native Hawaiian burial sites;	
8	(3)	Make recommendations regarding appropriate management,	
9		treatment, and protection of native Hawaiian burial	
10		sites, and on any other matters relating to native	
11		Hawaiian burial sites;	
12	(4)	Elect a chairperson for a four-year term who shall	
13		serve for [not] no more than two consecutive terms;	
14		and	
15	(5)	Maintain a list of appropriate Hawaiian organizations,	
16		agencies, and offices to notify regarding the	
17		discovery of remains."	
18	SECT	ION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that	
19	matured, p	penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were	
20	begun before its effective date.

Island Burial Councils; Appointments; Holdover Members

Description:

Allows any burial council member whose term has expired to continue in office as a holdover member until the member's reappointment to a second term is confirmed or a successor is nominated and appointed. Prohibits holdover members from holding office beyond the end of the fourth regular session of the legislature following the expiration of the member's term of office. (SD2)
