
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DRIVING WITHOUT A LICENSE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 286-136, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

3 "(b) Any person who is convicted of violating section 286-
4 102, 286-122, 286-130, 286-131, 286-132, 286-133, or 286-134
5 shall be subject to a minimum fine of \$500 and a maximum fine of
6 \$1,000, or imprisoned no more than one year, or both, if the
7 person has two or more prior convictions for the same offense in
8 the preceding five-year period[-]; provided that upon a third
9 conviction for the same offense within five years, the vehicle
10 owned and used by the defendant in the commission of the third
11 offense may be ordered by the court to be subject to forfeiture
12 under chapter 712A; provided further that if the defendant is
13 not the registered owner of the vehicle used in the commission
14 of the third offense, the listed owner of the vehicle shall file
15 a petition to the court explaining why the owner allowed the
16 unlicensed driver to operate the vehicle and pay all storage
17 fees, court costs, and fines."





Report Title:

Driving Without a License; Penalties; Vehicle; Forfeiture

Description:

Adds confiscation of a vehicle as a maximum penalty on a third conviction for operating a motor vehicle without a license within a five-year period. Provides that if the defendant is not the registered owner of the vehicle used to commit the third offense, the owner of the vehicle shall be responsible for certain costs and fines.
