A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE LAND CONSERVATION FUND.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the land
- 2 conservation fund does not receive adequate funding to conserve
- 3 land for watershed protection, coastal preservation, flood
- 4 prevention, parks, habitat protection, cultural preservation,
- 5 agricultural production, and open space and scenic resources.
- 6 The legislature further finds that increasing the revenue stream
- 7 for the land conservation fund will ensure greater protection of
- 8 these lands and resources for future generations; grow a more
- 9 sustainable and resilient future; and help to maintain
- 10 sufficient open space and breathing room for residents and
- 11 visitors, all of which serves the best interests of the people
- 12 of Hawaii.
- 13 Additionally, enhanced funding for the acquisition and
- 14 management of resource value lands strengthens the State's
- 15 portfolio of high-value, long-term investment in protecting
- 16 Hawaii's natural capital, and the returns on this investment
- 17 accelerate community efforts to strengthen resilience, promote



- 1 health and wellness, and continue building and operating new
- 2 models of economic opportunity.
- 3 The purpose of this Act is to help ensure adequate funding
- 4 for the land conservation fund and the legacy land conservation
- 5 program by increasing the maximum amount of conveyance tax
- 6 revenues to be paid into the land conservation fund.
- 7 SECTION 2. Section 247-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 8 amended to read as follows:
- 9 "\\$247-7 Disposition of taxes. All taxes collected under
- 10 this chapter shall be paid into the state treasury to the credit
- 11 of the general fund of the State, to be used and expended for
- 12 the purposes for which the general fund was created and exists
- 13 by law; provided that of the taxes collected each fiscal year:
- 14 (1) Ten per cent or [\$5,100,000,] \$, whichever
- is less, shall be paid into the land conservation fund
- established pursuant to section 173A-5; and
- 17 (2) Fifty per cent or \$38,000,000, whichever is less,
- shall be paid into the rental housing revolving fund
- established by section 201H-202."
- 20 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 21 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

1 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.
