A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CRIMINAL JUSTICE REFORM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that persons accused of 2 committing a crime are required to make an initial appearance in 3 court, and that the failure to appear in court results in the 4 issuance of an arrest warrant. The legislature notes that 5 arrests consume a significant portion of limited police 6 resources, increase the number of persons held in custody before 7 trial, and contribute to overcrowding in correctional facilities. The legislature further finds that many factors may 8 9 cause a person to fail to appear in court, not necessarily 10 malicious intent. Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to provide for a forty-eight hour grace period after a missed 11 12 initial court appearance.

13 SECTION 2. Chapter 805, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 14 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 15 and to read as follows:

16 "<u>\$805-</u> Initial court appearance; failure to appear;
17 grace period. A person who fails to appear in court for the

3 SECTION 4. Section 805-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4 amended to read as follows:

5 "§805-5 Warrant after summons issued. The district judge 6 [may], for any cause [which] that appears to the district judge 7 to be sufficient, [at any time] after the issue of the summons, 8 and by virtue of the complaint therein contained and recited, 9 may issue the district judge's warrant for the immediate arrest, 10 upon the charge, of the person so summoned [-;]; provided that if 11 the court granted a grace period pursuant to section 805- or 806- , the warrant shall not be issued until forty-eight hours 12 13 after the person's failure to appear in response to the 14 summons." 15 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed

16 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

17 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
