#### HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES THIRTY-SECOND LEGISLATURE, 2024 STATE OF HAWAII

H.B. NO. 1614

### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TEACHERS.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that teachers are the 2 most important component in facilitating student learning. The 3 national board for professional teaching standards certification 4 is the highest professional distinction available in education 5 for teachers. According to the National Board for Professional 6 Teaching Standards, research shows that students of 7 board-certified teachers learn more than their peers who are not board certified. Studies have also found that the positive 8 9 impact of being taught by a board-certified teacher is even 10 greater for racially and economically disadvantaged children. 11 The legislature further finds that, according to the 12 National Board for Professional Teaching Standards, as of 13 January 2023, there are seven hundred seventy-five national

14 board certified teachers in Hawaii. The legislature established 15 a bonus of \$5,000 in 2004 to incentivize teachers to become 16 board-certified through the National Board for Professional 17 Teaching Standards' certification program. The bonus was

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1 expanded in 2007 to provide an additional \$5,000 for teachers in 2 restructuring schools under the federal No Child Left Behind 3 Act. In 2015, the additional \$5,000 bonus was extended to all 4 teachers who maintain national board certification and who teach 5 at focus, priority, or superintendent's zone schools; schools 6 with a high turnover rate; or hard-to-fill schools.

7 The legislature additionally finds that continuing to 8 incentivize national board certification for teachers requires 9 adjusting the bonus for board certification to account for 10 increases in the State's cost of living. Accordingly, the 11 purpose of this Act is to increase the bonus for all teachers 12 who achieve and maintain national board certification to \$15,000 13 and appropriate funds for the bonus increase.

SECTION 2. Section 302A-706, Hawaii Revised Statutes, isamended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

16 "(a) There is established within the department the 17 teacher national board certification incentive program to 18 recognize and support exemplary teaching practice by supporting 19 public school teachers who have achieved national board 20 certification under the certification program of the National

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1	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general			
2	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$4,000,000 or so much			
3	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 to fund			
4	the bonus of \$15,000 for each teacher who achieves and maintains			
5	a national board certification pursuant to section 302A-706,			
6	Hawaii Revised Statutes.			
7	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of			
8	education for the purposes of this Act.			
9	SECTION 4. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of			
10	the Hawaii State Constitution and sections 37-91 and 37-93,			
11	Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined that the			
12	appropriations contained in H.B. No. , will cause the state			
13	general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be			
14	exceeded by \$ or per cent. In addition, the			
15	appropriation contained in this Act will cause the general fund			
16	expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be further			
17	exceeded by \$ or per cent. The combined total			
18	amount of general fund appropriations contained in only these			
19	two Acts will cause the state general fund expenditure ceiling			
20	for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be exceeded by			

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1 \$ per cent. The reasons for exceeding the or 2 general fund expenditure ceiling are that: 3 (1)The appropriation made in this Act is necessary to 4 serve the public interest; and 5 (2) The appropriation made in this Act meets the needs 6 addressed by this Act. SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 7 8 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 9 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval; 10 provided that section 3 shall take effect on July 1, 2024. 11
