

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE SAFETY OF EDUCATIONAL WORKERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that, in recognition of 2 the indispensable role that department of education employees 3 play in shaping the future and welfare of the State's children, 4 it is imperative to acknowledge the department employees' duty 5 to provide education to all children, regardless of their diverse background. A commitment to inclusivity, enhancement of 6 7 safeguards for educational workers who may encounter instances 8 of harassment, and the establishment of a mechanism to address 9 such conditions, is essential to ensuring a secure and conducive 10 environment for educators and students. 11 The purpose of this Act is to provide increased protection 12 for educational workers by: 13 (1)Requiring the department of education to take certain 14 steps to better address harassment of educational 15 workers; and

(2) Establishing the offense of harassment of an

educational worker.

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I	SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"§302A- Educational workers; protection and workplace
5	safety; harassment; reporting; training. (a) Educational
6	workers shall not be required to work under unsafe or hazardous
7	conditions or perform tasks which imminently endangers the
8	educational worker's health or safety. Such conditions shall
9	include but are not limited to harassment of an educational
10	worker.
11	(b) When any educational worker believes that an unsafe or
12	hazardous condition exists for the worker, including situations
13	involving harassment, the immediate supervisor of the worker
14	shall be informed immediately and shall take appropriate action
15	using the procedures established pursuant to subsection (d)(3).
16	(c) An educational worker who seeks judicial protection
17	from harassment, including obtaining a temporary restraining
18	order, shall be entitle to a leave of absence with pay to attend
19	court proceedings related to such protection. The duration of
20	the leave of absence with pay shall be reasonable and sufficient

1	to allow	the e	ducational worker to fulfill their court-related

3	(d)	The	department shall:		
4	(1)	Cond	uct a formal investigation of all substantial or		
5		repe	ated incidents of harassment submitted to the		
6		depa	rtment by an educational worker;		
7	(2)	Repo	rt all substantial incidents of harassment		
8		invo	lving an educational worker to the proper law		
9		enfo	rcement authority within forty-eight hours of the		
10		inci	dent being reported;		
11	(3)	Impl	ement procedures for the handling of harassment of		
12		educ	ational workers, including educational workers		
13		excl	uded from collective bargaining under chapter 89;		
14		prov	ided that:		
15		(A)	The procedures shall be included in the		
16			department's opening of the school year packet		
17			provided to all department employees annually;		
18			and		
19		<u>(B)</u>	The procedures shall be posted on the		
20			department's website;		

I	(4)	Develop a written emergency safety plan for aiding
2		educational workers who have potentially harmful
3		situations, including situations involving harassment,
4		occurring in their work areas; provided that the
5		department shall give consideration to suggestions
6		provided by educational workers in developing the
7		emergency safety plan;
8	(5)	Assign one full-time employee within the department to
9		handle and document harassment claims submitted to the
10		department;
11	(6)	Assist educational workers with any legal actions that
12		may arise from harassment, including obtaining
13		representation from the department of the attorney
14		general and covering the costs incurred from serving
15		temporary restraining orders related to substantial or
16		repeated incidents of harassment; and
17	(7)	Implement annual training for all educational workers
18		on how to use de-escalation techniques and handle
19		harassment from outside actors.
20	(e)	For the purposes of this section, "educational worker"
21	means any	administrator, specialist, counselor, teacher, or

ı	embrokee	of the department; a person who is a volunteer, as				
2	defined i	n section 90-1, in a school program, activity, or				
3	function that is established, sanctioned, or approved by the					
4	department; or a person hired by the department on a contractual					
5	basis and engaged in carrying out a department function."					
6	SECTION 3. Chapter 711, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is					
7	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated					
8	and to re	ad as follows:				
9	" <u>§71</u>	1- Harassment of an educational worker. (1) A				
10	person co	mmits the offense of harassment of an educational				
11	worker if	, with intent to harass, annoy, or alarm an educational				
12	worker, t	hat person:				
13	<u>(a)</u>	Strikes, shoves, kicks, or otherwise touches an				
14		educational worker in an offensive manner or subjects				
15		the educational worker to offensive physical contact;				
16		<u>or</u>				
17	<u>(b)</u>	Insults, taunts, or challenges an educational worker				
18		in a manner likely to provoke an immediate violent				
19		response or that would cause the educational worker to				
20		reasonably believe that the actor intends to cause				
21		bodily injury to the educational worker or another or				

1	damage to the property of the educational worker or
2	another.
3	(2) Harassment of an educational worker is a misdemeanor.
4	(3) For the purposes of this section, "educational worker"
5	means any administrator, specialist, counselor, teacher, or
6	employee of the department of education or an employee of a
7	public charter school; a person who is a volunteer, as defined
8	in section 90-1, in a school program, activity, or function that
9	is established, sanctioned, or approved by the department of
10	education or a public charter school; or a person hired by the
11	department of education or a public charter school on a
12	contractual basis and engaged in carrying out a department of
13	education or public charter school function."
14	SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
15	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
16	begun before its effective date.
17	SECTION 5. New statutory material is underscored.
18	SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
