# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ENERGY.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Act 159, Session
- 2 Laws of Hawaii 2015 (Act 159), authorized the high technology
- 3 development corporation to provide fifty per cent matching
- 4 grants of up to \$500,000 to Hawaii businesses that were awarded
- 5 alternative energy research grants by the United States
- 6 Department of Defense Office of Naval Research between 2015
- 7 and 2017. The Hawaii Office of Naval Research grant program was
- 8 established to implement Act 159.
- 9 In the program's final year, the legislature passed Act 69,
- 10 Session Laws of Hawaii 2017 (Act 69), which, in part, changed
- 11 the name of the high technology development corporation to the
- 12 Hawaii technology development corporation. In its 2017 annual
- 13 report, the Hawaii technology development corporation noted that
- 14 it had awarded a total of \$950,000 to three local companies,
- 15 which were then matched with a total of \$10,200,000 in federal
- 16 funds. The legislature finds that re-establishing this program
- 17 would align with the State's goal to achieve one hundred per



- 1 cent clean energy by the year 2045, while encouraging economic
- 2 growth and diversification.
- Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to re-establish the
- 4 two-year Hawaii Office of Naval Research grant program.
- 5 SECTION 2. (a) There is established within the department
- 6 of business, economic development, and tourism, a two-year
- 7 Hawaii Office of Naval Research grant program to provide grants
- 8 to qualified businesses conducting research and development in
- 9 alternative energy. The purpose of the program shall be to
- 10 promote the research and development of alternative energy in
- 11 Hawaii by authorizing the Hawaii technology development
- 12 corporation to provide matching grants to businesses that meet
- 13 criteria established in subsection (b).
- 14 (b) Subject to the availability of funds, the Hawaii
- 15 technology development corporation may provide a grant to any
- 16 business that:
- 17 (1) Has been awarded a competitive contract from the
- 18 United States Department of Defense Office of Naval
- 19 Research that is related to research on alternative
- 20 energy and energy efficiency technologies in the
- fields of geothermal, solar, wind, ocean power,

1		hydrodynamics, bioenergy, biomass, solid waste, smart
2		grids, transportation, or demand response;
3	(2)	Is sixty per cent or more resident-owned; provided
4		that for purposes of this paragraph, "resident" shall
5		have the same meaning as defined in section 235-1,
6		Hawaii Revised Statutes;
7	(3)	Is a for-profit entity organized under the laws of the
8		State;
9	(4)	Has been doing business in the State for not less than
10		one year;
11	(5)	Agrees to expend all grant funds awarded pursuant to
12		this Act in the State; and
13	(6)	Conducts research in alternative energy that has a
14		high technology readiness level or high potential for
15		implementation as evidenced by a contract with the
16		United States Department of Defense Office of Naval
17		Research, that is funded by moneys designated by the
18		United States Congress as funding for alternative
19		energy and a national defense budget funding
20		directive, and is existing and active or was granted

- 1 within three years prior to the effective date of this
- 2 Act;
- 3 provided that the amount of any grant awarded pursuant to this
- 4 Act shall not exceed fifty per cent of the amount of the grant
- 5 awarded to the business by the United States Department of
- 6 Defense Office of Naval Research; provided further that the
- 7 business shall not be eligible for a grant pursuant to this
- 8 section if the business has obtained any other state grant for
- 9 the same research, other than the grant awarded to the business
- 10 by the United States Department of Defense Office of Naval
- 11 Research, at the time of or during the duration of the grant
- 12 from the Hawaii Office of Naval Research grant program.
- 13 (c) The Hawaii Office of Naval Research grant program
- 14 shall cease to exist on June 30, 2026.
- 15 (d) The department of business, economic development, and
- 16 tourism shall adopt rules, pursuant to chapter 91, Hawaii
- 17 Revised Statutes, necessary for the purposes of implementing the
- 18 Hawaii Office of Naval Research grant program.
- 19 SECTION 3. There is established the alternative energy
- 20 research and development revolving fund for the purpose of
- 21 promoting alternative energy research and development in Hawaii.

1 The alternative energy research and development revolving 2 fund shall be abolished on June 30, 2026, and all unencumbered balances shall lapse to the credit of the general fund. 3 4 SECTION 4. In accordance with section 9 of article VII, of 5 the Constitution of the State of Hawaii and sections 37-91 and 37-93, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined 6 7 that the appropriations contained in this Act will cause the state general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 8 to be exceeded by \$ , or per cent. The reasons 9 10 for exceeding the general fund expenditure ceiling are that the 11 appropriations made in this Act are necessary to serve the public interest and to meet the need provided for by this Act. 12 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general 13 14 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be 15 deposited into the alternative energy research and development 16 17 revolving fund. 18 SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the alternative 19 energy research and development revolving fund the sum of 20 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 21 year 2024-2025 for the purpose of the Hawaii Office of Naval

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- 1 Research grant program; provided that the moneys appropriated by
- 2 this Act shall not lapse at the end of the 2024-2025 fiscal
- 3 year; provided further that any moneys that remain unencumbered
- 4 on June 30, 2026, shall lapse on that date.
- 5 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii
- 6 technology development corporation for the purposes of this Act.
- 7 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2024.

#### Report Title:

Hawaii Technology Development Corporation; Alternative Energy Research; Matching Grants; Office of Naval Research; Appropriations; General Fund Expenditure Ceiling Exceeded

#### Description:

Authorizes the Hawaii Technology Development Corporation to temporarily re-establish the Hawaii Office of Naval Research Grant Program to provide 50 per cent matching grants to Hawaii awardees of alternative energy research grants from the U.S. Department of Defense Office of Naval Research. Establishes the Alternative Energy Research and Development Revolving Fund. Appropriates moneys into and out of the revolving fund. Declares that the appropriations exceed the state general fund expenditure ceiling for 2024-2025.
