

A BILL FOR AN ACT

PROPOSING AMENDMENTS TO ARTICLE X, SECTION 2 AND ARTICLE XVIII, SECTION 12, OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF HAWAII TO ESTABLISH LOCAL ELECTED SCHOOL BOARDS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii is the only
- 2 state in the nation where a single department of education and a
- 3 single statewide board run all public schools. This centralized
- 4 school system a holdover from the plantation era comes with
- 5 several drawbacks. Every public school is required to follow
- 6 the same set of state regulations, guidelines, and testing
- 7 apparatus. This system leaves little room for flexibility in
- 8 introducing new training approaches or trying new instructional
- 9 programming. As a result, teachers are unable to adjust
- 10 pedagogy to individual learning styles.
- 11 The legislature finds that entrusting the governance of
- 12 public schools to their communities to oversee local school
- 13 districts results in a well-functioning education system.
- 14 Additionally, elected board members can address the unique
- 15 education-related needs of their respective districts for better
- 16 tailored improvements in public education. Decentralization in

- 1 education significantly improves repetition rates, dropout
- 2 rates, graduation rates, and test scores. Localized school
- 3 boards serve as the community's voice and directly address the
- 4 distinct needs of each district. Focused efforts on the school-
- 5 level translates to overall improved student achievement.
- 6 The purpose of this Act is to amend the Constitution of the
- 7 State of Hawaii to provide for multiple, local school boards,
- 8 that are populated with elected board members, serving no more
- 9 than twelve years as a member, in place of the current Board of
- 10 Education.
- 11 SECTION 2. Article X, section 2, of the Hawaii
- 12 Constitution is amended to read as follows:
- 13 "BOARD OF EDUCATION
- 14 Section 2. There shall be [a] five [board] boards of
- 15 education [. The governor shall nominate and, by and with the
- 16 advice and consent of the senate, appoint the members of the
- 17 board of education, as provided by law.] composed of members who
- 18 shall be elected in a nonpartisan manner by qualified voters, as
- 19 provided by law. No person shall serve as a member for more
- 20 than twelve years in their lifetime. One board shall cover the
- 21 entire state and be composed of members who reside anywhere

within the state. The four other boards shall each cover one 1 2 county area. Each county school board district shall be divided 3 into departmental school districts, as may be provided by law. 4 There shall be at least one member residing in each departmental 5 school district for the county-specific boards of education." 6 SECTION 3. Article XVIII, section 12, of the Hawaii 7 Constitution is amended to read as follows: 8 "BOARD OF EDUCATION TRANSITION 9 Section 12. There shall be a period of transition from the **10** [elected] appointed to the [appointed] elected [board] boards of 11 education, as provided by law." 12 The question to be printed on the ballot shall SECTION 4. 13 be as follows: 14 "Shall the Board of Education be changed from a single 15 board appointed by the governor to one statewide board and 16 four countywide boards elected by the qualified voters of **17** the State, serving no more than twelve years as a member, 18 as provided by law?" 19 SECTION 5. Constitutional material to be repealed is

bracketed and stricken. New constitutional material is

underscored.
