

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THEFT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the surge in theft
- 2 perpetrated by organized retail crime rings is threatening
- 3 communities and businesses in Hawaii. According to the National
- 4 Retail Federation's 2022 National Retail Security Survey,
- 5 businesses saw a 26.5 per cent increase in organized retail
- 6 crime incidents. These crimes not only affect large department
- 7 stores but small businesses which comprise 99 per cent of the
- 8 business landscape in the islands.
- 9 To malicious actors, these crimes are considered low-risk
- 10 and yield a high-reward. To address this pervasive issue, nine
- 11 states passed laws in 2022 increasing penalties for organized
- 12 retail theft. Hawaii, ranking fifth among states for highest
- 13 average total value of stolen goods per resident, needs to join
- 14 this nationwide response to combat organized retail theft. The
- 15 purpose of this Act is to create the offense of organized retail
- 16 theft and provide penalties accordingly.



1	SECTION 2. Chapter 708, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is								
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated								
3	and to read as follows:								
4	"§708- Organized retail theft. (1) For purposes of this								
5	section:								
6	"Retailer" means a person or business that sells or								
7	facilitates the sale of merchandise to the public for use or								
8	consumption rather than for resale.								
9	(2) A person commits the offense of organized retail theft								
10	if the person intentionally:								
11	(a) Acts in concert with one or more persons to commit								
12	theft of merchandise from one or more retailers with								
13	intent to sell, exchange, or dispose of the								
14	merchandise for value; or								
15	(b) Acts in concert with one or more persons to receive,								
16	possess, conceal, store, or purchase merchandise								
17	explicitly represented to the person as being								
18	merchandise stolen from a retailer.								
19	(3) Violation of this section is:								

1	<u>(a)</u>	A Class C felony if the value or ago	gregate value of						
2		the merchandise involved in the act	is \$200 or more						
3		out less than \$750; or							
4	<u>(b)</u>	A Class B felony if the value or age	gregate value of						
5		the merchandise involved in the act	is \$750 or more.						
6	(4)	Jiolation of this section described	in subsection (3)						
7	is increased to the next higher categories of offense if the								
8	person re	ruits, coordinates, organizes, supe	rvises, directs,
