BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

 amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and

 to read as follows:

- 16 (c) Each birthing facility shall report Duchenne muscular
- 17 dystrophy screening data to the department of health for quality

- 1 assurance and improvement activities. At a minimum, the data
- 2 shall include:
- 3 (1) The numbers of newborns screened and not screened;
- 4 (2) The timing of screening after birth;
- 5 (3) Screening results; and
- 6 (4) Other data required by the department of health.
- 7 (d) The department of health shall adopt rules pursuant to
- 8 chapter 91 necessary for the purposes of this section.
- 9 (e) For the purposes of this section, "birthing facility"
- 10 shall have the same meaning as in section 321-296."
- 11 SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 12 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 13 begun before its effective date.
