### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TAXATION.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. (a) The department of taxation, in
2	consultat	ion with the department of business, economic
3	developme	nt, and tourism, shall study the feasibility of
4	replacing	the income and general excise taxes with a new retail
5	sales tax	or other tax.
6	(b)	As part of its study, the department of taxation shall
7	conduct a	n economic impact analysis of the effects of
8	restructuring the state tax system, including:	
9	(1)	Cost estimates of the proposed conversion to a retail
10		sales tax, including anticipated administrative costs;
11	(2)	The anticipated economic impact on taxpayers in Hawaii
12		arising from the conversion;
13	(3)	The expected percentage of the sales tax that will be
14		"exported" to visitors to Hawaii who purchase Hawaii
15		goods and services;
16	(4)	The anticipated impact on the collection of state tax

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revenues in Hawaii;

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1 (5) The expected rate at which the new sales tax must be 2 established in order to generate sufficient revenues 3 to replace the general excise and income taxes; and 4 (6) Any other information that the department of taxation 5 and department of business, economic development, and 6 tourism consider to be appropriate to policy makers. 7 (C) The department of taxation and department of business, economic development, and tourism shall consult with the Tax 8 9 Foundation of Hawaii, the Chamber of Commerce of Hawaii, and other private entities as may be necessary in the course of the 10 11 study.

(d) The department of taxation shall submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including any proposed implementing legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session of 2025.
