1 SECTION 1. Section 134-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: 3 The chief of police of a county [may] shall grant to an applicant a license to carry a pistol or revolver and 4 5 ammunition unconcealed on the licensee's person within the 6 county where the license is granted, if the applicant: 7 (1)Sufficiently establishes the urgency or need to carry 8 a firearm unconcealed; 9 (2) Is engaged in the protection of life and property; 10 (3) Satisfies each of the criteria established by or 11 pursuant to subsection (d); 12 (4)Is not prohibited under section 134-7 from the 13 ownership, possession, or control of a firearm and 14 ammunition; 15 Is not found to be lacking the essential character or (5) 16 temperament necessary to be entrusted with a firearm 17 as set forth in subsection (h);
