13	(4)	Strategies to best identify and intervene in
14		situations in which persons having Alzheimer's disease
15		or related types of dementia may be at particular risk
16		of abuse or neglect.

1	(b) Law enforcement officers shall review training	
2	materials provided by the board, in accordance with this	
3	section, for a minimum of one hour each year.	
4	(c) The training materials shall be provided to applicable	
5	law enforcement officers at no cost; provided that the board	
6	shall seek funding from nonprofit organizations for the training	
7	materials.	
8	(d) The board may coordinate with employers of law	
9	enforcement officers to develop applicable training materials	
10	and standards.	
11	(e) The board may utilize educational and training	
12	resources available in the public and private sectors to develop	
13	training materials required under this section."
