### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 302A-404, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "§302A-404 School meals[-]; universal free school
- 4 breakfast and lunch. (a) School meals shall be made available
- 5 under the school meals program in every school where the
- 6 students are required to eat meals at school.
- 7 (b) Beginning with the 2024-2025 school year, free school
- 8 breakfast shall be provided to every student enrolled in a
- 9 department school, regardless of a student's eligibility for
- 10 participation in the federal school breakfast program. Free
- 11 school breakfast shall meet the meal requirements for breakfasts
- 12 established pursuant to title 7 Code of Federal Regulations
- 13 section 220.8.
- 14 (c) Beginning with the 2024-2025 school year, free school
- 15 lunch shall be provided to every student enrolled in a
- 16 department school, regardless of a student's eligibility for
- 17 participation in the national school lunch program. Free school

1 SECTION 2. Section 302A-405, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 3 "(a) [The] Except as provided in section 302A-404(b) and 4 (c), the price for school meals shall be set by the department 5 to ensure that moneys received from the sale of the meals shall 6 be [not] no less than one-half of the cost of preparing the 7 meals. The prices for school meals may be adjusted annually 8 based on the previous year's costs rounded to the nearest five 9 cents; provided that the department by rule shall provide a 10 lower rate or free meals to children based on their economic 11 need." 12 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ 13 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 to 14 15 the Hawaii child nutrition programs for the total plate costs 16 associated with providing universal free school breakfasts and lunches in department of education schools as required by this 17 18 Act after federal funding has been accounted. 19 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 20 education for the purposes of this Act.

1 SECTION 4. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of 2 the Hawaii State Constitution and sections 37-91 and 37-93, 3 Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined that the 4 appropriations contained in H.B. No. , will cause the state 5 general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be 6 exceeded by \$ per cent. In addition, the or 7 appropriation contained in this Act will cause the general fund 8 expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be further 9 exceeded by \$ or per cent. The combined total 10 amount of general fund appropriations contained in only these 11 two Acts will cause the state general fund expenditure ceiling 12 for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be exceeded by 13 per cent. The reasons for exceeding the or 14 general fund expenditure ceiling are that: 15 The appropriation made in this Act is necessary to (1)16 serve the public interest; and 17 The appropriation made in this Act meets the needs (2) 18 addressed by this Act. 19 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed

and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2024.
