### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DISTRIBUTION MANAGEMENT.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that in 2019, program						
2	requirements for the Emergency Managing Performance Grant were						
3	updated to require that recipient's emergency operations plan						
4	include a distribution management plan. As the primary state						
5	agency responsible for emergency management, the Hawaii						
6	emergency management agency annually maintains the Hawaii State						
7	Distribution Management Plan, with the objective to establish						
8	and maintain an emergency distribution network to provide						
9	critical supplies to counties. Under the current plan, various						
10	forecast advisories and conditions for natural and mand-made						
11	occurrences are utilized as the primary means for indications						
12	and warnings to begin plan implementation. However, noticeably						
13	absent from the list of incident types is wildfires. The						
14	legislature believes that in the aftermath of the Lahaina						
15	wildfire and the overall rise in disasters occurring throughout						
16	the State in recent years, consideration should be given to						

- 1 updating this list to include all types of foreseeable disasters
- 2 that could impact the State.
- 3 The legislature further finds that the Lahaina wildfire and
- 4 its devastating impact on the community underscore the critical
- 5 need for an effective and efficient statewide distribution
- 6 management plan. While existing frameworks have served their
- 7 purpose to some extent, the recent Lahaina wildfires have
- 8 certainly demonstrated a need to shore up gaps in distribution
- 9 management and assess areas for improvement, such as language
- 10 access and animal welfare. The effectiveness of the State's
- 11 disaster relief efforts hinges on a robust, transparent, and
- 12 accountable distribution management plan that is continuously
- 13 being reviewed by pertinent stakeholders.
- 14 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to establish the
- 15 distribution management advisory board to develop and advise on
- 16 the statewide distribution management plan.
- 17 SECTION 2. Chapter 127A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 18 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 19 and to read as follows:
- 20 "\$127A- Distribution management advisory board;
- 21 <u>established.</u> (a) There is established the distribution

2	purposes.	The advisory board shall be subject to chapter 92.					
3	(b)	The advisory board shall serve in an advisory capacity					
4	to the agency. In this role, the board shall:						
5	(1)	Develop, review, and propose amendments to the					
6		statewide distribution management plan;					
7	(2)	Advise on resource allocation; and					
8	(3)	Submit findings and recommendations to the					
9		legislature, as applicable, twenty days prior to the					
10		convening of the regular session of 2025 immediately					
11		following the advisory board's review of the statewide					
12		distribution management plan and every four years					
13		thereafter.					
14	<u>(c)</u>	The distribution management advisory board shall					
15	consist of nine members to be appointed without regard to						
16	section 26-34 as follows:						
17	(1)	The administrator of the Hawaii emergency management					
18		agency, who shall serve as the chairperson;					
19	(2)	The director of health;					
20	(3)	One member appointed by the governor;					

1	(4)	One member representing a nonprofit organization, to					
2		be appointed by the president of the senate;					
3	(5) One member representing a public business, to be						
4		appointed by the speaker of the house of					
5		representatives; and					
6	(6)	The administrator or director of each county emergency					
7		management agency for the city and county of Honolulu,					
8		and the counties of Hawaii, Kauai, and Maui.					
9	<u>(d)</u>	Nongovernmental members appointed to the advisory					
10	board pursuant to subsections (c)(2), (3), and (4) shall serve						
11	for a term of four years. Members shall serve without						
12	compensation but may be reimbursed for expenses, including						
13	travel expenses, incurred in the performance of their duties.						
14	<u>(e)</u>	The advisory board shall not adopt any decision that					
15	would jeopardize the receipt of any form of federal funding or						
16	engage in any activity that could jeopardize the receipt of						
17	federal aid or assistance."
