

A BILL FOR AN ACT

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that following the Maui

RELATING TO SCHOOL SAFETY.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

2	wildfires in August of 2023, the speaker of the state house of
3	representatives established six bipartisan interim working
4	groups tasked with evaluating specific topics in the aftermath
5	of the wildfires and making recommendations for appropriate
6	legislative action in the regular session of 2024. Members of
7	the working groups collaborated with federal, state, and county
8	agencies, along with community stakeholders and interested
9	parties, to identify immediate issues that require temporary or
10	transitional relief for the people and businesses of west Maui.
11	The legislature further finds that the schools working
12	group was specifically tasked with evaluating strategies
13	utilized to accommodate displaced students and staff to return
14	to school and preparing recommendations for appropriate
15	legislative action. All working groups released a joint final

report in December 2023 detailing their findings and

recommendations.

I	The purpose of this Act is to adopt the recommendation of	Í
2	the schools working group by requiring:	
3	(1) The department of education to grant public access	to
4	emergency action plans that do not pose a security	
5	risk to students, staff, or guests of school campus	es;
6	(2) Each department school to have a comprehensive scho	ol
7	evacuation communication plan for use during	
8	emergencies; and	
9	(3) The department of education to collaborate with the	
10	department of transportation to assess all departme	nt
11	school campuses to determine if there are sufficien	t
12	emergency evacuation routes for each campus.	
13	SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
14	amended by adding two new sections to be appropriately	
15	designated and to read as follows:	
16	"§302A- Emergency action plans; public access. (a)	
17	The department shall create emergency action plans for each	
18	department school and allow for public access to the plans;	
19	provided that access to the emergency action plans does not p	ose
20	a security risk to students, staff, or guests visiting a scho	ol
21	campus.

2	that would	trigger the closure of a school, including weather
3	and other	environmental situations.

2		plan to ensure that the plan is effective and all
3		individuals involved know their roles and
4		responsibilities;
5	(4)	Cultural awareness and responsiveness to translation
6		needs of the community and accessibility needs of
7	•	students and individuals with disabilities; provided
8		that the department shall work with language access
9		experts to supports schools in the development of the
10		communication plan; and
11	(5)	Involvement of the community through input from
12		students, parents, guardians, staff, and emergency
13		responders.
14	<u>(c)</u>	The school evacuation communication plan and any
15	updates to	the plan shall be shared with all students, parents,
16	guardians,	, and staff at the beginning of the school year
17	through:	
18	(1)	Posting on the appropriate school's website and social
19		media pages; and
20	(2)	Sending a copy of the plan to each student's parents
21		or guardians.

1	(d) Schools shall collect and maintain up-to-date contact
2	information for all students, parents, and guardians at the
3	beginning of the school year and update the information as
4	needed. Annual reminders to update contact information shall be
5	sent to each student's parents or guardians."
6	SECTION 3. (a) The department of education, in
7	collaboration with the department of transportation, shall
8	assess all department of education school campuses and determine
9	if there are sufficient emergency evacuation routes for each
10	campus.
11	(b) The department of education shall report its findings
12	and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the
13	legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
14	the regular session of 2025.
15	SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
16	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Report Title:

Department of Education; Emergency Action Plans; Comprehensive School Evacuation Communication Plans; Department of Transportation; Evacuation Routes

Description:

Requires the Department of Education to grant public access to emergency action plans that do not pose a security risk to students, staff, or guests of school campuses. Requires each Department school to have a comprehensive school evacuation communication plan for use during emergencies. Requires the Department of Education to collaborate with the Department of Transportation to assess all Department school campuses to determine if there are sufficient emergency evacuation routes for each campus and report to the Legislature.

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
