# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES.

#### **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that following the Maui 2 wildfires in August 2023, the speaker of the state house of 3 representatives established six bipartisan interim working groups tasked with evaluating specific topics and making 4 recommendations for appropriate legislative action in the 5 regular session of 2024. Members of the working groups 6 7 collaborated with federal, state, and county agencies, along 8 with community stakeholders and interested parties, to identify 9 immediate issues that require temporary or transitional relief 10 for the people and businesses of west Maui.

11 The legislature further finds that the wildfire prevention 12 working group was specifically tasked with identifying the 13 causes of wildfires and preventative action that may be taken to 14 reduce the risk of wildfires throughout the State and preparing 15 recommendations for appropriate legislative action. All working 16 groups released a joint final report in December 2023 detailing 17 their findings and recommendations.

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1	The purpose of this Act is to adopt a recommendation of the				
2	wildfire prevention working group by appropriating funds to				
3	maintain and update wildfire-specific equipment and wildfire-				
4	suppression infrastructure statewide.				
5	SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general				
6	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so				
7	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for				
8	operating costs to support fire and emergency response,				
9	prevention and pre-suppression activities, and post-fire				
10	restoration.				
11	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of				
12	land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.				
13	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general				
14	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so				
15	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for				
16	equipment for the department of land and natural resources'				
17	division of forestry and wildlife, to be allocated as follows:

SECTION 5. The director of finance is authorized to issue 13 14 general obligation bonds in the sum of \$ or so much 15 thereof as may be necessary and the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary is appropriated for fiscal year 2024-2025 16 for the purpose of wildfire water infrastructure capital 17 18 improvement projects for the department of land and natural 19 resources.



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The sum appropriated for the capital improvement projects
 listed in this section shall be expended by the department of
 land and natural resources.

SECTION 6. The appropriation made for the capital
improvement projects authorized by this Act shall not lapse at
the end of the fiscal year for which the appropriation is made;
provided that all moneys from the appropriation unencumbered as
of June 30, 2026, shall lapse as of that date.

9 SECTION 7. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of 10 the Hawaii State Constitution and sections 37-91 and 37-93, 11 Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined that the 12 appropriations contained in H.B. No. , will cause the state 13 general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be 14 exceeded by \$ per cent. In addition, the or appropriations contained in this Act will cause the general fund 15 16 expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be further 17 exceeded by \$ or per cent. The combined total amount of general fund appropriations contained in only these 18 19 two Acts will cause the state general fund expenditure ceiling 20 for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be exceeded by
