

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FIRE PROTECTION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that in the aftermath of
- 2 the Lahaina wildfire, six house of representatives interim
- 3 working groups were established and charged with evaluating
- 4 specific topics related to the wildfire and making
- 5 recommendations for appropriate legislative action in the
- 6 regular session of 2024. The wildfire prevention working group
- 7 was tasked to identify the causes of wildfires and preventative
- 8 action that may be taken to reduce the risk of wildfires
- 9 throughout the State.
- 10 The legislature further finds that Hawaii is the only state
- 11 without a state fire marshal. In 1979, the position of the
- 12 state fire marshal was abolished and replaced with the state
- 13 fire council. The state fire council is now composed of the
- 14 fire chiefs of the four counties, the state aircraft rescue fire
- 15 fighting unit, and the state protections forester from the
- 16 department of land and natural resources, division of forestry
- 17 and wildlife. The state fire council's members serve as non-



- 1 compensated volunteers as their time allows from their full-time
- 2 employment. The state fire council has an office staff
- 3 consisting of two part-time administrative specialists. The
- 4 legislature further finds that rising global temperatures have
- 5 increased the risk of fires and dangerous weather conditions in
- 6 the State and as these risks increase, the State will be better
- 7 served by having a dedicated state fire marshal.
- 8 The purpose of this Act is to enact a recommendation of the
- 9 wildfire prevention working group that establishes the office of
- 10 the state fire marshal to direct statewide efforts in preventing
- 11 and responding to fires throughout the State.
- 12 SECTION 2. Chapter 132, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 13 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 14 and to read as follows:
- 15 "§132- Office of the state fire marshal established.
- 16 (a) There is established the office of the state fire marshal
- 17 within the department of labor and industrial relations. The
- 18 office shall be headed by a state fire marshal, who shall be
- 19 appointed by the state fire council without regard to chapters
- 20 76 and 89, to serve for a period of years and at the

1	preasure	of the state life council. The state life marshal may
2	hire staf	f as necessary.
3	(b)	The state fire marshal shall have the qualifications,
4	experienc	e, and expertise in fire safety, prevention, and
5	control n	ecessary to successfully perform the duties of the
6	position.	
7	(c)	The state fire marshal shall:
8	(1)	Oversee the adoption and enforcement of fire safety
9		codes within the State;
10	(2)	Assist in the investigation of fires when requested by
11		a county;
12	(3)	Conduct inspections of state buildings and facilities
13		to ensure fire safety compliance;
14	(4)	Coordinate with county fire departments and other
15		agencies in promoting fire safety and the efficient
16		deployment of fire operations in the State;
17	<u>(5)</u>	Provide and coordinate public education and awareness
18		on fire safety;
19	(6)	Oversee the training and certification of fire
20		inspectors and investigators in the State;

1	(/)	Maintain records of all fires in the State, including
2		the causes and circumstances;
3	(8)	Administer state level fire protection training and
4		aid in the establishment of training facilities and
5		programs;
6	(9)	Assist in the disbursement of federal grants for fire
7		protection purposes to the counties; and
8	(10)	Perform other duties as necessary or delegated by the
9		state fire council."
10	SECT	ION 3. The state fire council shall submit a report of
11	its findi	ngs and recommendations, including any proposed
12	legislatio	on, to the legislature by November 1, 2024. The report
13	shall inc	lude the following, at minimum:
14	(1)	An organizational plan, including structure and
15		personnel plan, for the office of the state fire
16		marshal;
17	(2)	A description of the roles and division of
18		responsibilities between the State and the counties,
19		and the office of the state fire marshal and the state
20		fire council, regarding fire prevention and response;
21		and

1	(3) Proposed operating budget for the office of the state
2	fire marshal.
3	SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
4	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so muc
5	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for the
6	establishment and operation of the office of the state fire
7	marshal, including the establishment of one full-time equivalen-
8	(1.0 FTE) administrative staff position.
9	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
10	labor and industrial relations for the purposes of this Act.
11	SECTION 5. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of
12	the Hawaii State Constitution and sections 37-91 and 37-93,
13	Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined that the
14	appropriations contained in H.B. No. , will cause the state
15	general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be
16	exceeded by \$ or per cent. In addition, the
17	appropriation contained in this Act will cause the general fund
18	expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be further
19	exceeded by \$ or per cent. The combined total
20	amount of general fund appropriations contained in only these
21	two Acts will cause the state general fund expenditure ceiling

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1	for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be exceeded by
2	\$ or per cent. The reasons for exceeding the
3	general fund expenditure ceiling are that:
4	(1) The appropriation made in this Act is necessary to
5	serve the public interest; and
6	(2) The appropriation made in this Act meets the needs
7	addressed by this Act.
8	SECTION 6. New statutory material is underscored.
9	SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2024.

Description:
