A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that following the August
- 2 2023 Maui wildfires, the speaker of the state house of
- 3 representatives established six bipartisan interim working
- 4 groups tasked with evaluating specific topics in the aftermath
- 5 of the wildfires and making recommendations for appropriate
- 6 legislative action in the regular session of 2024. Members of
- 7 the working groups collaborated with federal, state, and county
- 8 agencies, along with community stakeholders and interested
- 9 parties, to identify immediate issues that require temporary or
- 10 transitional relief for the people and businesses of west Maui.
- 11 The legislature further finds that the jobs and business
- 12 working group was specifically tasked with evaluating the Maui
- 13 unemployment rate, approaches to restart business activity, and
- 14 impacts to tourism statewide and preparing recommendations for
- 15 appropriate legislative action. All working groups released a
- 16 joint final report in December 2023 detailing their findings and
- 17 recommendations. Ensuring proper legislative action to

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- 1 effectuate the recommendations is a matter of statewide concern
- 2 pursuant to article X, section 6, of the Hawaii State
- 3 Constitution.
- 4 The purpose of this Act is to adopt the recommendation of
- 5 the jobs and business working group by funding adjunct faculty
- 6 positions at the university of Hawaii Maui college to train
- 7 persons in construction trades.
- 8 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 9 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 10 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for
- 11 the establishment of limited-term employment (LTE)
- 12 temporary adjunct faculty positions at the university of Hawaii
- 13 Maui college to train persons in construction trades.
- 14 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the university of
- 15 Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.
- 16 SECTION 3. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of
- 17 the Hawaii State Constitution and sections 37-91 and 37-93,
- 18 Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined that the
- 19 appropriations contained in H.B. No. , will cause the state
- 20 general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be
- 21 exceeded by \$ or per cent. In addition, the

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- ${f 1}$ appropriation contained in this Act will cause the general fund
- 2 expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be further
- 3 exceeded by \$ or per cent. The combined total
- 4 amount of general fund appropriations contained in only these
- 5 two Acts will cause the state general fund expenditure ceiling
- 6 for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be exceeded by
- 7 \$ or per cent. The reasons for exceeding the
- 8 general fund expenditure ceiling are that:
- 9 (1) The appropriation made in this Act is necessary to
- serve the public interest; and
- 11 (2) The appropriation made in this Act meets the needs
- addressed by this Act.
- SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.
