A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO UNMANNED AIRCRAFT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 711, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and
- 3 to read as follows:
- 4 "PART . UNMANNED AIRCRAFT
- 5 §711-A Definitions. As used in this part:
- 6 "Aircraft" means any device, craft, vehicle, or contrivance
- 7 that is invented, used, or designed to navigate, fly, or travel
- 8 in the air, or that is used or intended to be used for flight in
- 9 the air.
- 10 "Bodily injury" has the same meaning as provided in section
- **11** 707-700.
- "Contraband" has the same meaning as provided in section
- **13** 710-1023.
- 14 "Dangerous instrument" has the same meaning as provided in
- 15 section 707-700.
- 16 "Drug" has the same meaning as provided in section
- **17** 710-1022.



- 1 "Electric gun" has the same meaning as provided in section
- 2 134-81.
- 3 "Explosive" means a device composed of a single ingredient,
- 4 or mixture of ingredients, capable of instantaneously releasing
- 5 a sufficient amount of energy to inflict substantial damage to
- 6 persons or property, and includes fireworks as defined in
- 7 section 132D-2.
- 8 "Firearm" has the same meaning as provided in section
- 9 134-1.
- 10 "Intoxicant" has the same meaning as provided in section
- **11** 291E-1.
- "Prison" includes jails, prisons, correctional centers,
- 13 correctional facilities, and detention centers.
- 14 "Serious bodily injury" has the same meaning as provided in
- 15 section 707-700.
- 16 "Substantial bodily injury" has the same meaning as
- 17 provided in section 707-700.
- 18 "Unmanned aircraft" means any aircraft that is operated or
- 19 designed to be operated without a person in or on the aircraft,
- 20 or without the possibility of direct human intervention from
- 21 within or on the aircraft.



1	"Under the influence" has the same meaning as provided in		
2	section 291E-1; provided that the term "unmanned aircraft" shall		
3	be substituted for the term "vehicle" as used therein.		
4	"Weapon of mass destruction" means any weapon that is		
5	designed or intended to cause death or serious bodily injury		
6	through the release, dissemination, or impact of toxic or		
7	poisonous chemicals, or other precursors, and includes any		
8	weapon involving a biological agent, toxin, or vector and any		
9	weapon designed to release radiation or radioactivity at a level		
10	dangerous to human life.		
11	$\S711-B$ Misuse of unmanned aircraft in the first degree.		
12	(1) A person commits the offense of misuse of unmanned aircraft		
13	in the first degree if the person intentionally or knowingly:		
14	(a) Equips or arms an unmanned aircraft with a firearm,		
15	explosive, electric gun, or weapon of mass		
16	destruction;		
17	(b) Possesses, receives, transfers, operates, or produces		
18	an unmanned aircraft that is equipped or armed with a		
19	firearm, explosive, electric gun, or weapon of mass		
20	destruction;		

1	(c)	Discharges or deploys a firearm, explosive, electric
2		gun, or weapon of mass destruction using an unmanned
3		aircraft;
4	(d)	Operates an unmanned aircraft and thereby
5		intentionally, knowingly, or recklessly interferes
6		with or disrupts the operation of any manned aircraft
7	(e)	Uses an unmanned aircraft to transport and introduce,
8		or to attempt to introduce, contraband, drugs, or
9		dangerous instruments into a prison;
10	(f)	Uses an unmanned aircraft in furtherance of the
11		commission of a felony; or
12	(g)	Operates an unmanned aircraft and thereby causes
13		serious bodily injury to another person.
14	(2)	Misuse of unmanned aircraft in the first degree is a
15	class A f	elony.
16	(3)	Subsection (1)(a), (b), (c), (d), and (g) shall not
17	apply to	any police officer, deputy sheriff, or fire department

\$711-C Misuse of unmanned aircraft in the second degree.

4 (1) A person commits the offense of misuse of unmanned aircraft

in the second degree if the person intentionally or knowingly:

- (a) Disables any required identification transmission or
 signaling of an unmanned aircraft;
- 8 (b) Disables or obscures any anti-collision lighting of an 9 unmanned aircraft or fails to have or illuminate the 10 lighting as required by law or by the rules, regulations, and orders of the Federal Aviation 12 Administration;
- (c) Operates an unmanned aircraft and thereby causessubstantial bodily injury to another person; or
- 15 (d) Operates an unmanned aircraft and thereby damages the
 16 property of another, without the other's consent, in
 17 an amount exceeding \$20,000.
- (2) Misuse of unmanned aircraft in the second degree is a
 class B felony. A person convicted of violating this section,
 notwithstanding any law to the contrary, shall not be eligible

for a deferred acceptance of guilty plea or nolo contendere plea 1 2 under chapter 853. 3 This section shall not apply to any police officer, 4 deputy sheriff, or fire department personnel acting within the 5 course and scope of their duties, or to any other person acting under the authority of, or pursuant to a contract with, the 6 7 United States or a state or county government, or any department 8 or agency of the United States or a state or county government. §711-D Misuse of unmanned aircraft in the third degree. 9 (1) A person commits the offense of misuse of unmanned aircraft 10 in the third degree if the person intentionally, knowingly, or 11 12 recklessly: 13 Removes, obliterates, alters, or tampers with the (a) 14 identification or registration number of an unmanned 15 aircraft; 16 (b) Operates an unmanned aircraft and thereby obstructs, 17 impairs or hinders the performance of a police 18 officer, deputy sheriff, or fire department personnel 19 acting under color of their official authority; **20** (c) Operates an unmanned aircraft and thereby causes

bodily injury to another person;

- 4 (e) Operates an unmanned aircraft while under the5 influence of an intoxicant; or
- 6 (f) Operates an unmanned aircraft after the person's
 7 license, certificate, or privilege to operate an
 8 unmanned aircraft has been revoked, suspended, or
 9 otherwise restricted by the issuing governmental
 10 authority.
- 11 (2) Misuse of unmanned aircraft in the third degree is a
 12 class C felony. A person convicted of violating this section,
 13 notwithstanding any law to the contrary, shall not be eligible
 14 for a deferred acceptance of guilty plea or nolo contendere plea
 15 under chapter 853.
- 16 (3) This section shall not apply to any police officer,
 17 deputy sheriff, or fire department personnel acting within the
 18 course and scope of their duties, or to any other person acting
 19 under the authority of, or pursuant to a contract with, the
 20 United States or a state or county government, or any department
 21 or agency of the United States or a state or county government."

1	SECTION 2. Chapter 711, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended as follows:
3	1. By designating sections 711-1100 to 711-1113 as part I,
4	entitled "General Provisions".
5	2. By designating section 711-1114 for inclusion within
6	the new part added by section 1 of this Act.
7	SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
8	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
9	begun before its effective date.
10	SECTION 4. In codifying the new sections added by
11	section 1 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute
12	appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating
13	the new sections in this Act.
14	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
