A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CESSPOOL CONVERSIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Act 153, Session 2 Laws of Hawaii 2022, established a cesspool compliance grant pilot project to assist property owners, including lessees on 3 4 Hawaiian home lands, with upgrading, converting, or 5 connecting a cesspool. 6 The purpose of this Act is to: Increase the cesspool compliance grant amount from 7 (1)8 \$20,000 to \$30,000 and update a reference to the 9 University of Hawaii's Hawaii cesspool hazard 10 assessment and prioritization tool; and 11 (2) Appropriate funds for the cesspool compliance pilot 12 grant project for fiscal year 2024-2025 and to 13 establish positions to implement the project. 14 SECTION 2. Act 153, Session Laws of Hawaii 2022, is 15 amended by amending section 2 to read as follows: 16 "SECTION 2. (a) There is established in the department of 17 health the cesspool compliance pilot grant project to assist

12	(b)	The department of health shall not grant awards to any
13	owner of r	eal property with a cesspool or lessee on Hawaiian
14	home lands	with a cesspool unless:
15	(1)	The cesspool is located in an area identified as
16]	priority level 1 or 2 in the University of Hawaii's
17		[2021] <u>2022</u> Hawaii cesspool hazard assessment and
18]	prioritization tool;
19	(2)	The owner or lessee provides the department with the
20		tax return required by this section; and

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1	(3)	An application, the form of which shall be decided by
2		the department, is submitted and deemed completed by
3		the department of health.
4	(C)	No grant under this section shall be awarded to any:
5	(1)	Owner of real property; or
6	(2)	Lessee on Hawaiian home lands,
7	with a hou	sehold income greater than one hundred forty per cent
8	of the are	a median income as determined by the United States
9	Department	of Housing and Urban Development.
10	The o	wner's or lessee's household income shall be verified
11	using the	tax return of the most recent taxable year that is
12	closed.	
13	(d)	The department of health shall grant awards on a
14	first-come	, first-served basis, subject to funding availability
15	and the cr	iteria set forth in subsections (b) and (e).
16	(e)	The owner or lessee shall provide the department of
17	health wit	h the following before a grant may be awarded:
18	(1)	Design plans prepared by a licensed engineer for a
19	,	wastewater system that complies with chapter 11-62,
20	I	Hawaii Administrative Rules;



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1	(2)	A licensed engineer's final construction inspection
2		report with photos and as built plans and
3		certification that the system was constructed in
4		accordance with the design plans approved by the
5		director of health;
6	(3)	A copy of an approval to use letter of the wastewater
7		system issued by the director of health; and
8	(4)	Receipts of payment made to the licensed engineer and
9		licensed contractor.
10	(f)	The department of health shall grant awards not to
11	exceed [\$	20,000] <u>\$30,000</u> based on receipts of payment submitted
12	under sub	section (e)(4); provided that cesspools that have been
13	upgraded	or converted to a director of health-approved
14	wastewate	r system before the passing of this Act shall not be
15	eligible	for this grant.
16	(g)	The department of health may adopt rules as necessary
17	to carry	out the cesspool compliance pilot grant project;
18	provided	that the rules may allow third parties to claim a grant
19	award on	behalf of the owner of real property with a cesspool or
20	lessee on	Hawaiian home lands with a cesspool.

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1	[(h) The department of health shall submit to the
2	legislature a report on the pilot grant project, including any
3	findings and recommendations, and any proposed legislation, no
4	later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular
5	session of 2024.]"
6	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
7	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$5,000,000 or so much
8	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 to
9	implement the cesspool compliance pilot grant project
10	established pursuant to Act 153, Session Laws of Hawaii 2022;
11	provided that:
12	(1) The appropriation may be used to contract for services
13	to establish and administer the project; and
14	(2) All moneys from the appropriation unencumbered as of
15	June 30, 2026, shall lapse as of that date.
16	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
17	health for the purposes of this Act.
18	SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
19	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$151,000 or so much
20	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 to
21	establish one full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) program specialist

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V position and one full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) planner IV
position to implement the cesspool compliance pilot grant
project established pursuant to Act 153, Session Laws of
Hawaii 2022, and perform other cesspool conversion-related
work.

6 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of7 health for the purposes of this Act.

8 SECTION 5. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of 9 the Hawaii State Constitution and sections 37-91 and 37-93, 10 Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined that the 11 appropriations contained in H.B. No. , will cause the state 12 general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be 13 exceeded by \$ or per cent. In addition, the 14 appropriation contained in this Act will cause the general fund 15 expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be further 16 exceeded by \$5,151,000 or per cent. The combined total 17 amount of general fund appropriations contained in only these 18 two Acts will cause the state general fund expenditure ceiling 19 for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be exceeded by

20 \$ or per cent. The reasons for exceeding the 21 general fund expenditure ceiling are that:

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1	(1) The appropriations made in this Act are necessary to
2	serve the public interest; and
3	(2) The appropriations made in this Act meet the needs
4	addressed by this Act.
5	SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
6	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
7	SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2024.
