### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE JUDICIARY.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	PART I. GENERAL PROVISIONS
2	SECTION 1. This Act shall be known and may be cited as the
3	Judiciary Supplemental Appropriations Act of 2024.
4	SECTION 2. Act 70, Session Laws of Hawaii 2023, is amended
5	by amending part II to read as follows:
6	"PART II. PROGRAM APPROPRIATIONS
7	SECTION 3. The following sums, or so much thereof as may
8	be sufficient to accomplish the purposes and programs designated
9	herein, are appropriated or authorized from the sources of
10	funding specified to the judiciary for the fiscal biennium
11	beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2025. The total
12	expenditures and the number of permanent and temporary positions
13	established in each fiscal year of the fiscal biennium shall not
14	exceed the sums and the position ceilings indicated for each
15	year, except as provided in this Act.

- 14 appropriated or authorized in part II of this Act for capital
- 15 improvement projects shall be expended by the judiciary for the

- 17 projects may be combined into a single project, if a combination
- 18 is advantageous or convenient for implementation; provided
- 19 further that the total cost of the projects thus combined shall
- 20 not exceed the total of the sums specified for the projects
- 21 separately. The amount after each cost element and the total

General obligation bonds may be issued, as provided by law, to yield the amount that may be necessary to 5 6 finance projects authorized in part II and listed in part IV of 7 this Act; provided that the sum total of the general obligation 8 bonds so issued shall not exceed [\$17,955,000." SECTION 6. Act 38, Session Laws of Hawaii 2019, as amended 9 10 by Acts 5 and 9, Session Laws of Hawaii 2020, is amended by 11 amending section 7.1 to read as follows: 12 "SECTION 7.1. [(a) Beginning on the effective date of 13 this Act the judiciary shall submit a weekly report to the 14 legislature that includes the following information for all 15 inmates released pursuant to supreme court orders entered in 16 SCPW-20-0000200 and SCPW-20-0000213: 17 (1) The inmate's name; 18 (2) The inmate's release date; 19 (3) The correctional center or facility where the inmate **20** was released from;

- 3 reasons for exceeding the general fund expenditure ceiling are
- 4 that the appropriations made in this Act are necessary to serve
- 5 the public interest and to meet the needs provided for by this
- 6 Act.
- 7 SECTION 8. If any portion of this Act or its application
- 8 to any person or circumstances is held to be invalid for any
- 9 reason, the remainder of the Act and any provision thereof shall
- 10 not be affected. If any portion of a specific appropriation is
- 11 held to be invalid for any reason, the remaining portion shall
- 12 be independent of the invalid portion and shall be expended to
- 13 fulfill the objective and intent of the appropriation to the
- 14 extent possible.
- 15 SECTION 9. If any manifest clerical, typographical, or
- 16 other mechanical error is found in this Act, the chief justice
- 17 may correct the error. All changes made pursuant to this
- 18 section shall be reported to the legislature at its next regular
- 19 session.
- 20 SECTION 10. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 21 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.



1 SECTION 11. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2024.
