A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DRIVING WHILE INTOXICATED.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. (a) The director of transportation shall	
2	convene an intoxicated driving reduction working group, under		
3	the leadership of Hawaii's strategic highway safety plan, to		
4	discuss, study, examine, and recommend transformative changes to		
5	the State's existing laws relating to the operation of a vehicle		
6	while under the influence of an intoxicant to reduce incidents		
7	of intoxicated driving.		
8	(b)	The working group shall consist of the following	
9	members or their designees:		
10	(1)	The director of transportation, who shall serve as the	
11		chair of the working group;	
12	(2)	A prosecutor from each county;	
13	(3)	A public defender from each county;	
14	(4)	The chair of the house standing committee on	
15		transportation;	
16	(5)	The chair of the senate standing committee on	
17	•	transportation; and	

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- 1 (6) A representative of law enforcement.
- 2 (c) The chair of the working group shall invite any other
- 3 person that the chair deems relevant to the purposes of the
- 4 working group.
- 5 (d) Members of the working group shall serve without
- 6 compensation and may conduct meetings remotely to carry out the
- 7 purposes of the working group.
- 8 (e) The working group shall discuss, study, and examine:
- 9 (1) The role of sobriety checkpoints in high-traffic
- 10 areas;
- 11 (2) Strategies and best practices for implementing and
- 12 utilizing sobriety checkpoints;
- 13 (3) Routine saturation patrols;
- 14 (4) The impact of reducing a person's permissible blood
- 15 alcohol level while operating a vehicle from .08 per
- cent to .05 per cent; and
- 17 (5) Means of attracting additional law enforcement to
- 18 sobriety checkpoints and saturation patrols.
- 19 (f) In conducting its work, the working group shall:
- 20 (1) Conduct informational meetings throughout the State
- 21 with community stakeholders;

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1	(2)	convene meetings to develop recommendations to better
2		coordinate and improve the protection of pedestrians
3		and motorists in the State; and
4	(3)	Identify best practices and methods to sustain
5		effective enforcement of state laws prohibiting the
6		operation of a vehicle while under the influence of an
7		intoxicant.
8	(g)	The department of transportation shall submit to the
9	legislature:	
10	(1)	The updated strategic highway safety plan with an
11	•	outline of policy recommendations to combat
12		intoxicated driving no later than December 31, 2024;
13		and
14	(2)	The strategic highway safety plan action plan with an
15		outline of policy recommendations to combat
16		intoxicated driving no later than December 31, 2025.
17	(h)	The working group shall cease to exist on June 30,
18	2026.
