A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE ARTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

The legislature finds that arts and culture 1 SECTION 1. 2 play an important role in society. In the wake of a disaster, 3 people may look to the arts for solace, comfort, and connection. 4 Art can help communities heal and may be a symbol of resilience 5 during recovery. According to the Federal Emergency Management 6 Agency, art can be effective in disaster recovery by providing 7 an opportunity for reflection; reducing the risk of conflict 8 caused by stress and the feeling of overwhelming hopelessness; 9 establishing new communities; reconnecting old communities; 10 reducing feelings of isolation; strengthening citizens' 11 connection to place; creating a shared sense of hope and 12 optimism; and channeling post-traumatic stress and anxiety into 13 creative and productive community outcomes.

14 The purpose of this Act is to:

15 (1) Authorize the state foundation on culture and the arts
16 to accept property gifted to the foundation for the
17 purpose of providing community venues for education,

2 other purposes supporting the foundation's mission; 3 (2) Establish a statewide arts program to provide greater access to the arts for children and communities in 4 need, with a focus on those affected by the August 5 2023 Maui wildfires; and 6 (3) Appropriate funds to the state foundation on culture 7 8 and the arts to develop partnerships with arts 9 organizations. SECTION 2. The state foundation on culture and the arts 10 11 may accept property gifted to the foundation for the purpose of 12 providing community venues for education, economic development, 13 revenue generation, and for other purposes supporting the 14 foundation's mission. 15 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 16 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 17 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 to 18 enable the state foundation of culture and the arts to develop 19 partnerships with art organizations and establish a statewide

3 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the state 4 foundation on culture and the arts for the purposes of this Act. 5 SECTION 4. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of 6 the Hawaii State Constitution and sections 37-91 and 37-93, 7 Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined that the 8 appropriations contained in H.B. No. , will cause the state 9 general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be 10 exceeded by \$ per cent. In addition, the or 11 appropriation contained in this Act will cause the general fund 12 expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be further 13 exceeded by \$ or per cent. The combined total 14 amount of general fund appropriations contained in only these 15 two Acts will cause the state general fund expenditure ceiling 16 for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be exceeded by 17 Ŝ

17 \$ or per cent. The reasons for exceeding the 18 general fund expenditure ceiling are that:

19 (1) The appropriation made in this Act is necessary to20 serve the public interest; and

- (2) The appropriation made in this Act meets the needs

- **3** SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.
