A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AN ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT PLANNING ORGANIZATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that designation of an 2 area as an economic development district by the United States

- 3 Economic Development Administration offers an opportunity to
- 4 advance coordinated and locally developed goals that leverage
- 5 and build upon interrelated community assets, such as its

- ${f 9}$ for annual federal funding to facilitate the formulation and
- 10 execution of a region's comprehensive economic development
- 11 strategy. The comprehensive economic development strategy is a
- 12 critical document that unlocks access to federal funding under
- 13 the United States Economic Development Administration's public
- 14 works and economic adjustment assistance programs. The United
- 15 States Economic Development Administration is substantially more
- 16 likely to invest federal funds in a designated economic

- 1 development district on a per capita basis than in areas that
- 2 have not been designated. To that end, the establishment of a
- 3 statewide economic development district is a key objective
- 4 identified in the 2023 Hawaii state comprehensive economic
- 5 development strategy.
- 6 The legislature further finds that the department of
- 7 business, economic development, and tourism has initiated the
- 8 designation process with the United States Economic Development
- 9 Administration for an economic development district encompassing
- 10 the State of Hawaii. The office of planning and sustainable
- 11 development was named as the district organization pursuant to
- 12 the requirements set forth in title 13 Code of Federal
- 13 Regulations section 304.2.
- 14 The legislature also finds that pursuant to title 13 Code
- 15 of Federal Regulations section 304.2(c)(3), a district
- 16 organization must be assisted by a professional staff having
- 17 economic development planning and coordination qualifications to
- 18 conduct the activities of the district organization, including
- 19 developing, managing, and supporting effective multi-level
- 20 partnerships to promote intra-district cooperation, self-help,
- 21 and public investment, to restore and sustain economic

- 1 resilience and prosperity; carrying out economic development
- 2 planning, coordination, and advisory functions to facilitate
- 3 implementation of the comprehensive economic development
- 4 strategy; and assisting community and economic development
- 5 organizations across the State to access United States Economic
- 6 Development Administration funding.
- 7 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to establish, and
- 8 appropriate moneys for, temporary positions to ensure that the
- 9 office of planning and sustainable development has the necessary
- 10 human resources to effectively conduct the activities of a
- 11 district organization pursuant to title 13 Code of Federal
- 12 Regulations part 304 to secure Hawaii's eligibility to access
- 13 the substantial advantages associated with a United States
- 14 Economic Development Administration-designated economic
- 15 development district.
- 16 SECTION 2. There are established full-time equivalent
- 17 (FTE) temporary positions within the office of planning and
- 18 sustainable development to support the activities of a district
- 19 organization for a statewide economic development district;
- 20 provided that the positions shall be exempt from chapters 76 and
- 21 89, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

- 1 SECTION 3. In accordance with section 9 of article VII, of 2 the Constitution of the State of Hawaii and sections 37-91 and
- 3 37-93, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined
- 4 that the appropriation contained in this Act will cause the
- 5 state general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025
- 6 to be exceeded by \$, or per cent. The reasons
- 7 for exceeding the general fund expenditure ceiling are that the
- 8 appropriation made in this Act is necessary to serve the public
- 9 interest and to meet the need provided for by this Act.
- 10 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
- 11 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 12 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for
- 13 the purposes of this Act, including the hiring of necessary
- 14 staff.
- The sum appropriated shall be expended by the office of
- 16 planning and sustainable development for the purposes of this
- 17 Act.
- 18 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.
