

### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that hotter temperatures
- 2 induced by climate change affect a student's ability to play,
- 3 gather, and learn outside while attending school. To reduce the
- 4 effect of hotter temperatures on students at department of
- 5 education schools, the department can take a more proactive
- 6 approach to increase the tree canopy on school campuses. In
- 7 addition to lowering the temperature on campuses through shade,
- 8 transpiration, and reduction of the heat island effect, trees
- 9 will also absorb storm water, clean the air, beautify campuses,
- 10 and help reach county and state environmental goals.
- 11 Furthermore, planting and caring for trees on campuses provide a
- 12 multitude of learning opportunities, including learning the role
- 13 trees play in the overall health of the ecosystem, cultural uses
- 14 of indigenous trees, tree propagation and care, and commercial
- 15 uses of trees.
- 16 The legislature further finds that, during the regular
- 17 session of 2021, the legislature adopted House Concurrent



- 1 Resolution No. 68, which requested that the department of
- 2 education create a landscape management plan with goals to
- 3 increase tree canopies on public school grounds, document
- 4 existing inventory and talent, and identify additional resources
- 5 required to implement and sustain the plan.
- 6 In addition, the department of education facilities
- 7 development branch has subcontracted a thorough professional
- 8 inventory of campus trees. The inventory includes digital maps
- 9 and information on each tree, including a risk assessment, note
- 10 of structural defects, entity assigned responsibility for
- 11 maintenance, pruning contracts, and contact for emergency help.
- 12 At the end of 2021, seventeen school inventories were completed
- 13 and an additional two or three were to be added each month going
- 14 forward. The inventory will be used to identify schools with
- 15 few trees and allow landscape architects to identify good spots
- 16 for new trees.
- 17 The legislature additionally finds that the department of
- 18 education can seize the task of managing the tree inventory as
- 19 an educational opportunity. There are approximately thirty-four
- 20 existing agriculture and natural resource programs in schools
- 21 statewide that are of different sizes and educate different

- 1 grades. These agriculture and natural resource programs can
- 2 support educational activities and encourage propagation of
- 3 native or fruit trees that can be planted and shared with
- 4 department of education schools and communities.
- 5 The legislature also finds that the department of education
- 6 needs additional personnel to manage the tree inventory. The
- 7 department of education has one full-time arborist who is
- 8 responsible for overseeing all trees on all campuses statewide.
- 9 An additional full-time arborist will increase the ability of
- 10 the department of education to manage the existing tree
- 11 inventory and add the right trees in the right places so that
- 12 the tree canopy will be expanded in a manner that is safe,
- 13 prevents damage to infrastructure, prevents liability for the
- 14 school and department of education, and maintains open outdoor
- 15 space for school use.
- The purpose of this Act is to:
- 17 (1) Establish the shade and fruit tree program in the
- department of education; and
- 19 (2) Appropriate funds for the shade and fruit tree program
- and for an arborist position to support the program.

1	SECT	ION 2. There is established in the department of
2	education	a shade and fruit tree program that may:
3	(1)	Use existing agriculture and natural resource programs
4		in schools and establish additional agriculture and
5		natural resource programs in other schools to educate
6		students and propagate native shade trees or fruit
7		trees, which shall be planted or shared amongst all
8		department schools;
9	(2)	Support schools with infrastructure and supplies to
10		establish nurseries for native shade tree or fruit
11		tree seedlings;
12	(3)	Encourage the propagation of native shade trees or
13		fruit trees appropriate to each school's climate;
14	(4)	Oversee the variety of native shade trees or fruit
15		trees for school planting and ensure their supply; and
16	(5)	Encourage the participation of students of all grades
17		and ages in the care of native shade trees or fruit
18		trees.
19	SECT	ON 3. There is appropriated out of the general
20	revenues o	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
21	much there	eof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for

- 1 the administration of the shade and fruit tree program
- 2 established pursuant to section 2 of this Act.
- 3 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 4 education for the purposes of this Act.
- 5 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
- 6 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 7 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for
- 8 the department of education to establish and hire one full-time
- 9 equivalent (1.00 FTE) permanent arborist position.
- 10 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 11 education for the purposes of this Act.
- 12 SECTION 5. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of
- 13 the Hawaii State Constitution and sections 37-91 and 37-93,
- 14 Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined that the
- 15 appropriations contained in H.B. No. , will cause the state
- 16 general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be
- 17 exceeded by \$ or per cent. In addition, the
- 18 appropriations contained in this Act will cause the general fund
- 19 expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be further
- 20 exceeded by \$ or per cent. The combined total
- 21 amount of general fund appropriations contained in only these

1	two Acts will cause the state general fund expenditure ceiling
2	for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be exceeded by
3	\$ or per cent. The reasons for exceeding the
4	general fund expenditure ceiling are that:
5	(1) The appropriations made in this Act are necessary to
6	serve the public interest; and
7	(2) The appropriations made in this Act meet the needs
8	addressed by this Act.
9	SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2024.
