A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE OFFICE OF ELECTIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that removing barriers
2	for persons with voting accessibility needs ensures that all
3	individuals have equal access to the voting process. Existing
4	law requires the state office of elections and each county
5	election office to remove barriers, promoting greater
6	participation in voting by individuals with access needs who may
7	be otherwise excluded. However, understanding the unique needs
8	of each community statewide can provide valuable insight on
9	current and future accessibility issues for voters.
10	Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to:
11	(1) Require the office of elections to annually request
12	funding for the statewide elections accessibility
13	needs advisory committee; and
14	(2) Appropriate funds to the office of elections for the
15	statewide elections accessibility needs advisory
16	committee to carry out its mandate.

SECTION 2. Section 11-10.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended to read as follows:

3 "\$11-10.5 Statewide elections accessibility needs advisory
4 committee[-]; annual budget request. (a) There is established
5 a statewide elections accessibility needs advisory committee
6 within the office of elections for administrative purposes. The
7 purpose of the advisory committee is to ensure equal and
8 independent access to voter registration, casting of ballots,
9 and all other office of elections services.

10 (b) The advisory committee shall consist of five members 11 appointed by the governor based on recommendations from 12 organizations within the State that are comprised of a majority of officers and members who are persons with disabilities 13 14 including visual impairment. Each member shall identify as a voter with accessibility needs arising from disabilities 15 16 including visual and hearing impairments that require an 17 accommodation to vote. The terms of advisory committee members 18 shall be four years; provided that initial terms shall be one, 19 two, three, or four years to ensure staggered rotation of 20 members.

1	(c) The advisory committee shall meet at least annually to
2	review election procedures, services, and technology and access
3	to information, and shall make recommendations to the office of
4	elections on at least an annual basis. The advisory committee
5	may meet and subsequently make recommendations at additional
6	times as determined by a majority of the members.
7	(d) Beginning with fiscal year 2025-2026 and each fiscal
8	year thereafter, the office of elections shall include in its
9	annual budget request line-item funding for the advisory
10	committee. To ensure the continuation of outreach and voter
11	education, the amount of funding requested shall scale
12	proportionally with fulfilled needs and funding requests
13	received by the advisory committee."
14	SECTION 3. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of
15	the Hawaii State Constitution and sections 37-91 and 37-93,
16	Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined that the
17	appropriations contained in Act 164, Regular Session of 2023,
18	and this Act will cause the state general fund expenditure
19	ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be exceeded by
20	\$ or per cent. This current declaration takes
21	into account general fund appropriations authorized for fiscal

year 2024-2025 in Act 164, Regular Session of 2023, and this Act
 only. The reasons for exceeding the general fund expenditure
 ceiling are that:

- 4 (1) The appropriation made in this Act is necessary to
 5 serve the public interest; and
- 6 (2) The appropriation made in this Act meets the needs
 7 addressed by this Act.

SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general 8 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$10,000 or so much 9 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for the 10 statewide elections accessibility needs advisory committee for 11 information gathering, outreach, and voter education expenses 12 approved by the advisory committee; provided that any funds 13 14 appropriated pursuant to this Act shall be in addition to and shall not supplant any portion of the base budget of the office 15 16 of elections.

17 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the office of18 elections for the purposes of this Act.

19 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed20 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

21 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2024.
