

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRAFFIC VIOLATIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 291C-111, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
- 3 "(a) With respect to highways under their respective
- 4 jurisdictions, the director of transportation is authorized to
- 5 and the counties by ordinance may prohibit or restrict the
- 6 stopping, standing, or parking of vehicles where the stopping,
- 7 standing, or parking is dangerous to those using the highway or
- 8 where the stopping, standing, or parking of vehicles would
- 9 interfere unduly with the free movement of traffic; provided
- 10 that the violation of any law or any ordinance, regardless of
- 11 whether established under this or any other section, prohibiting
- 12 or restricting the stopping, standing, or parking of vehicles
- 13 shall constitute a traffic infraction. The counties shall not
- 14 provide any other penalty, civil or criminal, or any other
- 15 charge, in the form of rental or otherwise, in place of or in
- 16 addition to the fine to be imposed by the district court for any

- 1 violation of any ordinance prohibiting or restricting the
- 2 stopping, standing, or parking of vehicles.
- 3 This section shall not be construed as prohibiting the
- 4 authority of the director of transportation or the counties to
- 5 allow the stopping, standing, or parking of motor vehicles at a
- 6 "T-shaped" intersection on highways under their respective
- 7 jurisdictions; provided that such stopping, standing, or parking
- 8 of motor vehicles is not dangerous to those using the highway or
- 9 where the stopping, standing, or parking of motor vehicles would
- 10 not unduly interfere with the free movement of traffic.
- 11 The appropriate police department and county or prosecuting
- 12 attorney of the various counties shall enforce any law or
- 13 ordinance prohibiting or restricting the stopping, standing, or
- 14 parking of vehicles, including but not limited to the issuance
- 15 of parking tickets. Any person committing a violation of any
- 16 law or ordinance, regardless of whether established under this
- 17 or any other section, prohibiting or restricting the stopping,
- 18 standing, or parking of vehicles shall be subject to a fine to
- 19 be enforced and collected by the district courts of this State
- 20 and to be deposited into the state general fund for state

- 1 use[-]; provided that fifty per cent of the amount collected
- 2 shall be disbursed to the county that enforced the violation."
- 3 SECTION 2. Section 291C-171, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 4 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
- 5 "(a) All fines and forfeitures collected upon conviction
- 6 or upon the forfeiture of bail of any person charged with a
- 7 violation of any section or provision of the state traffic laws
- 8 and all assessments collected relating to the commission of
- 9 traffic infractions shall be paid to the director of finance of
- 10 the State[-]; provided that the director of finance shall
- $11 \cdot$ disburse fifty per cent of the amount collected to the county
- 12 that enforced the violation."
- 13 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 14 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 15 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
