### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE LEGISLATURE.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the State's sunshine law, Hawaii's open meetings law, governs the manner in which state and county boards and commissions, including the county councils, must conduct their business. Conversely for the legislature, their rules of each respective chamber of the legislature take precedence over the application of the sunshine law.

8 The legislature further finds that sunshine laws promote 9 ethical standards, prevent fraud and corruption, and engender 10 greater public trust. When the sunshine law was originally 11 enacted, the legislature declared, and codified in statute, that 12 "it is the policy of this State that the formation and conduct 13 of public policy - the discussions, deliberations, decisions, 14 and action of governmental agencies - shall be conducted as openly as possible." The sunshine law helps ensure public trust 15 16 in the State's democratic process by making deliberations on 17 public policy decisions transparent.
