A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CIVIL SERVICE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

. 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the department of 2 land and natural resources' state historic preservation division experiences significant recruitment difficulties. The division 3 4 competes directly with cultural resource consultancies and the federal government. To be competitive with the private sector, 5 6 state historic preservation staff need wage increases between 7 twelve and fifty per cent. Although the current fiscal year 8 budget allows the state historic preservation division to make 9 these wage adjustments, such adjustments are not possible if the 10 positions are converted to civil service, as the wages would be 11 set by the department of human resources development.

12 The purpose of this Act is to allow the state historic 13 preservation division to offer more competitive wages for its 14 staff by authorizing the division to employ professional and 15 technical staff who are exempt from civil service laws.

16 SECTION 2. Section 6E-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
17 amended to read as follows:

12		or personal, in fee or in any lesser interest, by
13		gift, purchase, condemnation, devise, bequest, land
14		exchange, or other means; preservation, restoration,
15		administration, or transference of the property; and
16		the charging of reasonable admissions to that
17		property;
18	(3)	Development of a statewide survey and inventory to
19		identify and document historic properties, aviation
20		artifacts, and burial sites, including all those owned
21		by the State and the counties;

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1	(4)	Preparation of information for the Hawaii register of
2		historic places and listing on the national register
3		of historic places;
4	(5)	Preparation, review, and revisions of a state historic
5		preservation plan, including budget requirements and
6		land use recommendations;
7	(6)	Application for and receipt of gifts, grants,
8		technical assistance, and other funding from public
9		and private sources for the purposes of this chapter;
10	(7)	Provision of technical and financial assistance to the
11		counties and public and private agencies involved in
12		historic preservation activities;
13	(8)	Coordination of activities of the counties in
14		accordance with the state plan for historic
15		preservation;
16	(9)	Stimulation of public interest in historic
17		preservation, including the development and
18		implementation of interpretive programs for historic
19		properties listed on or eligible for the Hawaii
20		register of historic places;

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1	(10)	Coordination of the evaluation and management of
2		burial sites as provided in section 6E-43;
3	(11)	Acquisition of burial sites in fee or in any lesser
4		interest, by gift, purchase, condemnation, devise,
5		bequest, land exchange, or other means, to be held in
6		trust;
7	(12)	Submittal of an annual report to the governor and
8		legislature detailing the accomplishments of the year,
9		recommendations for changes in the state plan or
10		future programs relating to historic preservation, and
11		an accounting of all income, expenditures, and the
12		fund balance of the Hawaii historic preservation
13		special fund;
14	(13)	Regulation of archaeological activities throughout the
15		State;
16	(14)	Employment of sufficient professional and technical
17		staff for the purposes of this chapter [which shall be
18		in accordance with] who may be exempt from chapter 76;
19		provided that notwithstanding section 76-16(b)(17)(A),
20		the exemptions for these positions shall not expire;

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1	(15)	The charging of fees to be determined by the
2		department that are proportional to the nature and
3		complexity of the projects or services provided, and
4		adjusted from time to time to ensure that the
5		proceeds, together with all other fines, income, and
6		penalties collected under this chapter, do not surpass
7		the annual operating costs of the comprehensive
8		historic preservation program;
9	(16)	Adoption of rules in accordance with chapter 91,
10		necessary to carry out the purposes of this chapter;
11		and
12	(17)	Development and adoption, in consultation with the
13		office of Hawaiian affairs native historic
14		preservation council, of rules governing permits for
15		access by native Hawaiians and Hawaiians to cultural,
16		historic, and pre-contact sites and monuments."
17	SECT	ION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
18	and stric	ken. New statutory material is underscored.
19	SECT	ION 4. This Act shall take effect on June 30, 3000.
