A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO RESIDENCE FOR TUITION PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that, according to a
- 2 report by the university of Hawaii, Hawaii is projected to
- 3 produce fourteen thousand six hundred high school graduates per
- 4 year, on average, between school years 2012 and 2032.
- 5 The legislature further finds that there is a substantial
- 6 number of Hawaii high school graduates who have attended out of
- 7 state colleges and universities and later return home to Hawaii.
- 8 In some cases, upon their return, individuals who plan to enroll
- 9 at a university of Hawaii campus, including a community college,
- 10 find they do not qualify for Hawaii residence tuition because of
- 11 their time spent out of state.
- 12 The legislature finds that this is an issue of statewide
- 13 concern.
- 14 The purpose of this Act is to require the tuition residency
- 15 rules for the university of Hawaii to grant the resident tuition
- 16 fee for enrollment at any university of Hawaii campus, including
- 17 any community college, to all Hawaii high school graduates and

- ${f 1}$ persons who have received equivalent graduation credentials in
- 2 the State should they choose to return from out of state and
- 3 pursue higher education in Hawaii, under certain conditions.
- 4 SECTION 2. Section 304A-402, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 "[{]\$304A-402[}] Residence for tuition purposes; basic
- 7 rule. (a) The board of regents shall adopt the necessary rules
- 8 defining residence for tuition purposes herein; provided that
- 9 the basic rule shall be that a student shall qualify for the
- 10 resident tuition fee only if the [following] criteria of either
- 11 subsection (b) or (c) are met[+].
- 12 [(1) The] (b) Residency tuition shall apply if:
- 13 (1) The adult student, or in the case of a minor student,
- 14 the student's parents or guardians , has or have been
- a bona fide resident of this State for at least twelve
- 16 consecutive months next preceding the student's first
- 17 day of officially scheduled instruction for any
- 18 semester or term in which the student is enrolling at
- 19 the particular college or campus; and
- 20 (2) The adult or minor student has not been claimed as a
- 21 dependent for tax purposes for at least twelve months



1		next preceding the student's first day of officially
2		scheduled instruction for any semester or term in
3		which the student is enrolling at the particular
4		college or campus by the student's parents or
5		guardians who are nonresidents of the State; provided
6		that this provision shall not apply in cases where the
7		parent claiming the student as a dependent is entitled
8		to do so under a child support order or agreement
9		issued or entered into in conjunction with a divorce
10		proceeding or legal separation agreement and the other
11		parent and the student meet the criteria set forth in
12		paragraph (1).
13	(c)	Notwithstanding subsection (b), for the purposes of
14	enrollmen	t at any university of Hawaii campus, including any
15	community	college, residency tuition shall apply if the adult or
16	minor stu	dent:
17	(1)	Earned a Hawaii high school diploma, Hawaii high
18		school equivalency diploma, or Hawaii adult community
19		school diploma; and
20	(2)	Is working toward the student's first undergraduate
21		degree;

- 2 who has not been a bona fide resident of the State for more than
- 3 twelve years."
