RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF ACCOUNTING AND GENERAL SERVICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Section 26-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended b	y amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
3	"(b)	The department shall:
4	(1)	Preaudit and conduct after-the-fact audits of the
5		financial accounts of all state departments to
6		determine the legality of expenditures and the
7		accuracy of accounts;
8	(2)	Report to the governor and to each regular session of
9		the legislature as to the finances of each department
10		of the State;
11	(3)	Administer the state risk management program;
12	(4)	Establish and manage motor pools;
13	(5)	Manage the preservation and disposal of all records of
14		the State;
15	(6)	Undertake the program of centralized engineering and
16		office leasing services, including operation and
17		maintenance and lease buyback processing pursuant to

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1		subsection (d) of public buildings, for departments of					
2		the State;					
3	(7)	Undertake the functions of the state surveyor;					
4	(8)	Establish accounting and internal control systems;					
5	(9)	(9) Have the discretion to employ persons within the					
6		comptroller's office that shall be exempt from					
7		chapters 76 and 89 in support of communications,					
8		change management, and business process improvement					
9		programs as part of the State's information technology					
10		modernization efforts; provided that such persons					
11		shall be members of the state employees' retirement					
12	system and shall be eligible to receive the benefit						
13		of any state employee benefit program generally					
14		applicable to officers and employees of the State;					
15	[(9)]	(10) Under the direction of the chief information					
16		officer, provide centralized computer information					
17		management and processing services;					
18	[(10)]	(11) Establish a program to provide a means for					
19		public access to public information and develop an					
20		information network for state government;					

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1	[(11)]	<u>(12)</u>	Assume administrative responsibility for the
2		offic	ce of information practices; and
3	[(12)]	(13)	Approve state fleet acquisitions; provided that:
4		(A)	Beginning January 1, 2022, all new light-duty
5			motor vehicles that are passenger cars purchased
6			for the State's fleet shall be zero-emission
7			vehicles;
8		(B)	Beginning as soon as practicable but no later
9			than January 1, 2030, all new light-duty motor
10			vehicles that are multipurpose passenger vehicles
11			and trucks for the State's fleet shall be zero-
12			emission vehicles; and
13		(C)	The comptroller may authorize an exemption for
14			new fleet vehicle purchases if zero-emission
15			vehicles are demonstrated to be cost-prohibitive
16			on a lifecycle basis or unsuitable for the
17			vehicles' planned purpose, or if funds are
18			unavailable.
