people living in Hawaii is limited English proficient. 2 3 individuals often encounter disproportionate risks before, during, and after disasters. These risks include an inability 4 to understand evacuation orders and procedures, information from 5 emergency relief providers, impediments that slow access to 6 emergency medical care, sheltering assistance, and other forms 7 8 of emergent relief. Moreover, in the aftermath of a disaster, 9 many limited English proficient persons encounter barriers to

The legislature also finds that in the immediate aftermath
of the August 8, 2023, Maui wildfire, language interpreters and
sign language interpreters were not present at the shelters nor
was any provision made to assist individuals through remote

- 6 and continue to provide services as needed.

- 8 and federal language access laws and regulations, section 308 of
- 9 the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Act
- 10 (Stafford Act, P.L. 93-288, as amended) specifically requires
- 11 entities receiving funding from the Federal Emergency Management
- 12 Agency to identify limited English proficient populations to
- 13 ensure that they are incorporated into the disaster management
- 14 planning process; ensure that such populations can access
- 15 disaster relief information; and develop and maintain a database
- 16 identifying qualified language assistance programs that could be
- 17 activated in an emergency.
- 18 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds to
- 19 establish a limited English language access coordinator within

1 SECTION 2. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of 2 the Hawaii State Constitution and sections 37-91 and 37-93, 3 Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined that the appropriations contained in Act 164, Regular Session of 2023, 4 5 and this Act will cause the state general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be exceeded by 6 7 per cent. This current declaration takes orinto account general fund appropriations authorized for fiscal 8 year 2024-2025 in Act 164, Regular Session of 2023, and this Act 9 10 only. The reasons for exceeding the general fund expenditure 11 ceiling are that: 12 The appropriation made in this Act is necessary to (1)13 serve the public interest; and 14 (2) The appropriation made in this Act meets the needs 15 addressed by this Act. 16 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 17 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for 18 the establishment of one full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) limited 19 20 English language access coordinator for the Hawaii emergency 21 management agency.
