## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SAFETY.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that our public schools 2 have been marred by a series of disturbing incidents that have 3 jeopardized the safety and well-being of our children and 4 educators. In November 2022, Waikoloa elementary and intermediate school was placed on lockdown due to an armed 5 6 individual on campus. In October 2023, Waianae high school and 7 castle high school were forced to cancel a football game due to 8 credible gun threats. In December 2023, Nanakuli high school 9 reported an afterhours armed robbery. In January 2024, 10 Waimanalo elementary and intermediate school went on lockdown 11 due to a report about an armed individual on campus.

12 The legislature further finds that these incidents are not 13 isolated events but represent a growing trend of violence and 14 disruption within the State's public schools. Such threats 15 undermine the very foundation of education, creating an 16 atmosphere of fear and anxiety that impedes learning and 17 jeopardizes the future of Hawaii's children.



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1	The purpose of this Act is to ensure the protection of the
2	children of the State by requiring the department of education
3	to hire school resource officers at every department school and
4	every charter school.
5	SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
7	and to read as follows:
8	" <u>§302A-</u> School safety; school resource officers;
9	guards. (a) The department shall assign school resource
10	officers or guards registered pursuant to chapter 463 to serve
11	at each department school and charter school during hours when
12	students are expected to be on the school campus. In
13	determining the number of officers or guards that shall be
14	assigned to each department school and charter school, the
15	department shall consider:
16	(1) The size of the school campus;
17	(2) The number of students in the school; and
18	(3) Other factors relevant to student safety.
19	(b) The department shall seek federal grants to the extent
20	necessary for the costs relating to the hiring of school
21	resource officers and registered guards."



1	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
2	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
3	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for
4	the provision of school resource officers and guards at
5	department school and charter school.
6	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
7	education for the purposes of this Act.
8	SECTION 4. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of
9	the Hawaii State Constitution and sections 37-91 and 37-93,
10	Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined that the
11	appropriations contained in H.B. No. , will cause the state
12	general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be
13	exceeded by \$ or per cent. In addition, the
14	appropriation contained in this Act will cause the general fund
15	expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be further
16	exceeded by \$ or per cent. The combined total
17	amount of general fund appropriations contained in only these
18	two Acts will cause the state general fund expenditure ceiling
19	for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be exceeded by
20	\$ or per cent. The reasons for exceeding the
21	general fund expenditure ceiling are that:



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1	(1) The appropriation made in this Act is necessary to
2	serve the public interest; and
3	(2) The appropriation made in this Act meets the needs
4	addressed by this Act.
5	SECTION 5. New statutory material is underscored.
6	SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2024.
