A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that many of Hawaii's
- 2 farmers and ranchers are finding difficulty in securing the
- 3 financial support necessary to build a thriving, vibrant
- 4 business. Various sources of funding, including grants provided
- 5 by the United States Department of Agriculture and the State,
- 6 counties, and private entities, are available for farmers and
- 7 ranchers. Access to grants from the United States Department of
- 8 Agriculture and other sources can increase production capacity,
- 9 provide new business opportunities, and increase employment
- 10 opportunities within the State's agricultural industry.
- 11 The legislature further finds that farmers and ranchers
- 12 applying for grants may have to complete an application process
- 13 that is sometimes complex. Without specific technical expertise
- 14 in grant writing, many farmers and ranchers may be deterred from
- 15 applying for those grants. Well-trained and skilled grant
- 16 specialists would be able to assist farmers and ranchers in
- 17 obtaining and fulfilling the requirements of grants.

- 1 The purpose of this Act is to establish grant specialist
- 2 positions within the department of agriculture to assist farmers
- 3 and ranchers in applying for, obtaining, and fulfilling the
- 4 requirements of grants offered by the United States Department
- 5 of Agriculture, State, counties, or private entities.
- 6 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 7 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 8 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for
- 9 the establishment of two full-time equivalent (2.0 FTE) grant
- 10 specialist positions within the department of agriculture to
- 11 assist farmers and ranchers in applying for, obtaining, and
- 12 fulfilling the requirements of grants offered by the United
- 13 States Department of Agriculture, State, counties, or private
- 14 entities; provided that the grant specialist positions shall
- 15 prioritize assisting farmers and ranchers who produce local food
- 16 that is at least partly consumed within the State.
- 17 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 18 agriculture for the purposes of this Act.
- 19 SECTION 3. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of
- 20 the Hawaii State Constitution and sections 37-91 and 37-93,
- 21 Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined that the
