A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII FARM TO FOOD BANK PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to establish and appropriate funds for the Hawaii farm to food bank program to 2 3 fund food banks in the State to purchase, store, and transport 4 fresh locally grown or produced food to food insecure 5 communities. This program will serve the State's food needs, provide local food producers with a market to support their 6 7 operations, and keep moneys circulating within the State to 8 boost the local economy. 9 SECTION 2. Chapter 141, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 10 amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and 11 to read as follows: 12 . HAWAII FARM TO FOOD BANK PROGRAM "PART 13 §141-**Definitions.** For the purposes of this part: "Department" means the department of agriculture. 14 15 "Food bank" has the same meaning as in title 7 United 16 States Code section 7501(5).

- 4 agriculture for the purposes of this Act.
- 5 SECTION 4. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of
- 6 the Hawaii State Constitution and sections 37-91 and 37-93,
- 7 Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined that the
- 8 appropriations contained in H.B. No. , will cause the state
- 9 general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be
- 10 exceeded by \$ or per cent. In addition, the
- 11 appropriation contained in this Act will cause the general fund
- 12 expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be further
- 13 exceeded by \$5,000,000 or per cent. The combined total
