A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ANIMAL FUR PRODUCTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that animals slaughtered
for their fur endure tremendous suffering. Animals raised on
fur farms typically spend their entire lives in cramped and
filthy cages. Fur farmers typically use the cheapest killing
methods available, including suffocation, electrocution, gas,
and poison.

7 The legislature recognizes that fur farms are reservoirs 8 and transmission vectors for dangerous zoonotic disease, 9 including coronaviruses, that threaten public health, especially 10 in Hawaii. COVID-19 infections have been confirmed at fur farms 11 in Europe and the United States, and scientific studies have 12 linked mink, raccoon dogs, and foxes, the animals most commonly 13 farmed for their fur, to a variety of coronaviruses.

14 The legislature further finds that the fur production 15 process is energy intensive and has a significant environmental 16 impact, including air and water pollution. Runoff from the fur 17 production process contains high concentrations of phosphorus

and nitrogen, which are among the most common forms of water
pollution in the United States, including Hawaii.

3 Considering the wide array of alternatives for fashion and 4 apparel, the legislature finds that the demand for fur products 5 does not justify the unnecessary killing and cruel treatment of 6 animals, harm to the environment, and public health risks to the 7 people of the State caused by these practices. The legislature believes that eliminating the sale of fur products in the State 8 9 will decrease the demand for these cruelly produced and 10 environmentally harmful products, promote community awareness of 11 animal welfare, and, in turn, foster a more humane environment 12 in Hawaii and enhance the reputation of the State.

Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to prohibit thetrade of certain animal fur products in the State.

15 SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by 16 adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read 17 as follows:

ANIMAL FUR PRODUCTS

"CHAPTER

§ -1 Definitions. As used in this chapter:

"Fur" means any animal skin or part thereof with hair,
fleece, or fur fibers attached thereto, either in its raw or
processed state.

4 "Fur product" means any article of clothing or covering for 5 any part of the body, or any fashion accessory, including but 6 not limited to handbags, shoes, slippers, hats, earmuffs, 7 scarves, shawls, gloves, jewelry, keychains, toys or trinkets, 8 and home accessories and decor, that is made in whole or in part 9 of fur. "Fur product" does not include any of the following: 10 (1) An animal skin or part thereof that is to be converted 11 into leather, or which in processing will have the 12 hair, fleece, or fiber completely removed; 13 (2) Cowhide with the hair attached thereto; 14 (3) Deerskin with the hair attached thereto; 15 (4) Lambskin or sheepskin with the fleece attached 16 thereto; or 17 (5) The pelt or skin of any animal that is preserved 18 through taxidermy or for the purpose of taxidermy. 19 "Nonprofit organization" means any corporation that is 20 organized under title 26 United States Code section 501(c)(3)

1 and is created for charitable, religious, philanthropic, 2 educational, or similar purposes. 3 "Taxidermy" means the practice of preparing and preserving 4 the skin of an animal that is deceased and stuffing and mounting 5 it in lifelike form. 6 "Ultimate consumer" means an individual who buys a fur 7 product for the individual's own use, or for the use of another, 8 but not for resale or trade. 9 "Used fur product" means a fur product that has been worn 10 or used by an ultimate consumer. 11 S -2 Trade of animal fur products prohibited. (a) It 12 shall be unlawful to sell, offer for sale, display for sale, trade, or otherwise distribute for monetary or nonmonetary 13 14 consideration a fur product in Hawaii. 15 (b) For the purposes of this section, the sale, offer for 16 sale, display for sale, trade, or otherwise distribute for 17 monetary or nonmonetary consideration of a fur product shall be 18 deemed to occur in the State if: 19 (1)The buyer takes physical possession of the fur product 20 in the State; or 21 (2) The seller is located in the State.

1	§ -3 Exemptions. The prohibition in section -2 shall
2	not apply to the sale, offer for sale, display for sale, trade,
3	or distribution of:
4	(1) A used fur product by an individual, excluding a
5	retail transaction; nonprofit organization; or second-
6	hand store, including a pawn shop;
7	(2) A fur product used in the exercise of traditional and
8	customary rights protected pursuant to article XII,
9	section 7, of the Hawaii State Constitution; or
10	(3) A fur product where the activity is expressly
11	authorized by federal law.
12	§ -4 Penalties. Any person who violates this chapter
13	shall be subject to a fine not to exceed \$1,000. Each fur
14	product sold, offered for sale, displayed for sale, traded, or
15	distributed in violation of this chapter and each day on which
16	any such violation occurs shall constitute a separate offense."
17	SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
18	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
19	begun before its effective date.
20	SECTION 4. If any provision of this Act, or the

21 application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held

invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or
applications of the Act that can be given effect without the
invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions
of this Act are severable.

5 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2024.
