A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO COMMUNITY HEALTH WORKERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that community health 2 workers connect rural, underserved communities with programs and 3 services that impact social determinants of health and address 4 factors such as access to health care, prevention, outreach, and 5 training. Community health workers often serve in rural, 6 underserved communities and spend a significant portion of their 7 time doing telehealth and behavioral health, outreach such as 8 assisting individuals to apply for medical insurance, providing 9 health education resources, and locating work opportunities. 10 Community health workers may also serve as translators, 11 assisting their communities to navigate health care and social 12 service systems.

13 The legislature further finds that there is a great need 14 for community health workers, especially in rural and 15 underserved communities that do not have reliable access to 16 health education, resources, or job opportunities. As a 17 critical intermediary between residents and health care and



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social services, community health workers have a unique
 understanding of their community needs and accessibility to
 services. Establishing a pilot program for community health
 workers with clear parameters, including major responsibilities
 and scope of work, will allow community health workers to
 continue their valuable work to communities statewide.

7 Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to establish a three8 year rural community health worker pilot program to provide
9 outreach, education, training, and navigation to individuals
10 residing in rural communities and address social determinants of
11 health.

SECTION 2. (a) The department of health shall establish and administer a three-year rural community health worker pilot program for community health workers to provide outreach, education, training, and navigation to individuals residing in the State's rural communities and address social determinants of health.

(b) Community health workers participating in the rural
community health worker pilot program may provide health
education and outreach, individual support and assistance,

10		(B)	Submission of periodic reports on rural community

14	with a nom	nprofi	t organization to recruit, train, assign, and
15	supervise	commı	unity health workers and oversee the pilot
16	program.	The r	nonprofit organizations contracted under this
17	subsection	n shal	l have:
18	(1)	A his	story of providing community empowerment, capacity
19		build	ling, collaborative partnerships, and health
20		educa	ation to the State's rural communities;



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1	(2)	The knowledge and experience necessary to provide
2		community health worker services to program
3		participants;
4	(3)	The capacity to provide culturally competent training
5		and services; and
6	(4)	A board of directors and staff team consisting of a
7		majority of residents currently residing in a rural
8		community in the State.
9	(e)	Existing department of health personnel may be
10	assigned	to fulfill administrative and fiscal responsibilities
11	of the ru	ral community health worker pilot program.
12	(f)	The department of health, in conjunction with the
13	nonprofit	organization contracted under subsection (d), shall
14	submit in	terim reports on the development and administration of
15	the rural	community health worker pilot program, including any
16	proposed	legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty
17	days prio	r to the convening of the regular sessions of 2025,
18	2026, and	2027. Each interim report shall include a record of
19	pilot prod	gram activities and accomplishments, including:
20	(1)	Outreach and training of community health workers; and

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1	(2)	Services provided to program participants by a
2		community health worker.
3	(g)	The department of health shall submit a final report
4	on the ru	ral community health worker pilot program, including
5	any propo	sed legislation, to the legislature no later than
6	twenty da	ys prior to the convening of the regular session of
7	2028. Th	e final report shall include:
8	(1)	A record of pilot program activities and
9		accomplishments, including:
10		(A) Outreach and training of community health
11		workers; and
12		(B) Services provided to program participants by a
13		community health worker; and
14	(2)	A recommendation on whether to extend the pilot
15		program beyond three years.
16	(h)	For the purposes of this section:
17	"Com	munity health worker" means a frontline health worker
18	who is a	trusted member of the community in which the community
19	health wo	rker lives, is from the community, or who has an
20	unusually	close understanding of the community served that
21	enables t	he community health worker to:

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1	(1)	Build trusted relationships;		
2	(2)	Serve as a liaison between health and social services		
3		and the community;		
4	(3)	Facilitate access to services; and		
5	(4)	Improve the quality and cultural competence of service		
6		delivery.		
7	"Pro	gram participant" means a resident of a rural community		
8	in the St	ate who requests services by a community health worker		
9	through t	he rural community health worker pilot program.		
10	"Rural" means an area that is currently served by a			
11	critical access hospital as defined in section 346-1, Hawaii			
12	Revised S	tatutes.		
13	SECT	ION 3. There is appropriated out of the general		
14	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so		
15	much ther	eof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for		
16	the rural	community health worker pilot program, established		
17	pursuant to section 2 of this Act.			
18	The	sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of		
19	health fo	r the purposes of this Act.		
20	SECT	ION 4. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of		
21	the Hawai	i State Constitution and sections 37-91 and 37-93,		

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1	Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined that the
2	appropriations contained in Act 164, Regular Session of 2023,
3	and this Act will cause the state general fund expenditure
4 .	ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be exceeded by
5	\$ or per cent. This current declaration takes
6	into account general fund appropriations authorized for fiscal
7	year 2024-2025 in Act 164, Regular Session of 2023, and this Act
8	only. The reasons for exceeding the general fund expenditure
9	ceiling are that:
10	(1) The appropriation made in this Act is necessary to
11	serve the public interest; and
12	(2) The appropriation made in this Act meets the needs
13	addressed by this Act.
14	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.
