RELATING TO WEAPONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	TION 1. Chapter 134, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended b	by adding a new section to part I to be appropriately
3	designate	ed and to read as follows:
4	" <u>§</u> 13	4- Reports relating to certain orders. (a) No
5	later tha	n April 1, 2025, and April 1 of each year thereafter,
6	the depar	tment of the attorney general shall publish a report on
7	its publi	cly available website that includes for the prior
8	calendar	year and each month within that year, to the extent the
9	data is a	vailable, the number of instances in which:
10	(1)	A person subject to an order described in section
11		134-7(f) or 134-86(g) surrendered a firearm,
12		ammunition, or electric gun as a result of that order;
13		and
14	(2)	An order described in section 134-7(f) or 134-86(g)
15	1997 - 19	was denied, revoked, or allowed to expire, or the
16		corresponding action was withdrawn by the petitioner,
17		because the person subject to the order required a



1	firearm, ammunition, or electric gun for the purposes
2	of the person's employment.
3	(b) The judiciary, the department of law enforcement, the
4	police departments of the several counties, and other state and
5	county agencies shall provide to the department of the attorney
6	general the data necessary for the purpose of each annual
7	report, to the extent the data is available.
8	(c) The report required by this section may be published
9	within the report that is published pursuant to section
10	<u>134-9.6.</u> "
11	SECTION 2. Section 134-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
12	amended by amending subsection (f) to read as follows:
13	"(f) No person who has been restrained pursuant to an
14	order of any court, including a gun violence protective order
15	issued pursuant to part IV, from contacting, threatening, or
16	physically abusing any person, shall possess, control, or
17	transfer ownership of any firearm or ammunition, so long as the
18	protective order, restraining order, or any extension is in
19	effect $[-,]$; provided that the person may possess or control a
20	firearm and ammunition in the course of the person's employment
21	<u>if:</u>



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1	(1)	The order is not an order issued pursuant to part IV;
2	(2)	The person needs to possess or control a firearm and
3		ammunition for the purpose of the person's employment;
4	(3)	The employer lawfully owns the firearm and ammunition;
5	(4)	The person does not hold any ownership interest in the
6		employer or the firearm or ammunition, or any
7		management authority in the employer;
8	(5)	The employer prohibits the employee from possessing or
9		controlling the firearm or ammunition outside the
10		course of the person's employment;
11	(6)	The person has never possessed or controlled the
12		employer's firearm outside the course of the person's
13		employment; and
14	(7)	Upon demand by the presiding court, the person proves
15		to the court's satisfaction that paragraphs (2)
16		through (6) apply.
17	The p	protective order or restraining order shall
18	specifical	lly include a statement that possession, control, or
19	transfer o	of ownership of a firearm or ammunition by the person
20	named in t	the order is prohibited $[-]$, except in the course of the
21	person's e	employment, to the extent authorized by this



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1 subsection. The person shall relinquish possession and control of any firearm and ammunition owned by that person to the police 2 3 department of the appropriate county for safekeeping for the 4 duration of the order or extension thereof. At the time of 5 service of a protective order or restraining order involving 6 firearms and ammunition issued by any court, a police officer 7 may take custody of any and all firearms and ammunition in plain 8 sight, those discovered pursuant to a consensual search, and 9 those firearms surrendered by the person restrained. If the person restrained is the registered owner of a firearm and knows 10 the location of the firearm, but refuses to surrender the 11 12 firearm or disclose the location of the firearm, the person restrained shall be guilty of a misdemeanor. In any case, when 13 14 a police officer is unable to locate the firearms and ammunition either registered under this chapter or known to the person 15 16 granted protection by the court, the police officer shall apply 17 to the court for a search warrant pursuant to chapter 803 for 18 the limited purpose of seizing the firearm and ammunition." SECTION 3. Section 134-86, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 19 20 amended by amending subsection (g) to read as follows:



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1,	"(g) No person who has been restrained pursuant to an
2	order of any court, including an ex parte order as provided in
3	this subsection, from contacting, threatening, or physically
4	abusing any person or from possessing or owning a firearm, shall
5	possess, control, or transfer ownership of an electric gun, so
6	long as the protective order, restraining order, or any
7	extension is in effect[, unless the]; provided that:
8	(1) The person may possess or control an electric gun in
9	the course of the person's employment if:
10	(A) The person needs to possess or control an
11	electric gun for the purpose of the person's
12	employment;
13	(B) The employer lawfully owns the electric gun;
14	(C) The person does not hold any ownership interest
15	in the employer or the electric gun, or any
16	management authority in the employer;
17	(D) The employer prohibits the employee from
18	possessing or controlling the electric gun
19	outside the course of the person's employment;



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1	(E) The person has never possessed or controlled the
2	employer's firearm outside the course of the
3	person's employment; and
4	(F) Upon demand by the presiding court, the person
5	proves to the court's satisfaction that
6	subparagraphs (A) through (E) apply; and
7	(2) The order, for good cause shown, may specifically
8	[permits] permit the possession of an electric gun.
9	The restraining order or order of protection shall
10	specifically include a statement that possession, control, or
11	transfer of an electric gun by the person named in the order is
12	prohibited[. Such], subject to the exceptions of this
13	subsection. The person shall relinquish possession and control
14	of any electric gun owned by that person to the police
15	department of the appropriate county for safekeeping for the
16	duration of the order or extension thereof.
17	In the case of an ex parte order that includes a
18	restriction on the possession, control, or transfer of an
19	electric gun, the affidavit or statement under oath that forms
20	the basis for the order shall contain a statement of the facts
21	that support a finding that the person to be restrained owns,



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intends to obtain or transfer, or possesses an electric gun, and
that the electric gun may be used to threaten, injure, or abuse
any person. The ex parte order shall be effective upon service
pursuant to section 586-6.

5 At the time of service of a restraining order involving 6 electric guns issued by any court, the police officer may take 7 custody of any and all electric guns in plain sight, those 8 discovered pursuant to a consensual search, and those electric 9 guns surrendered by the person restrained.

10 For the purposes of this subsection, "good cause" shall not 11 be based solely upon the consideration that the person subject 12 to restraint pursuant to an order of any court, including an ex-13 parte order as provided for in this subsection, is required to 14 possess or carry an electric gun [during the course of the person's employment.] for the person's own safety. "Good cause" 15 includes but is not limited to the protection and safety of the 16 17 person to whom a restraining order is granted."

18 SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that 19 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were 20 begun before its effective date.



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SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

3 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
