A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HUMAN SERVICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to amend Act 130,
- 2 Session Laws of Hawaii 2022, by clarifying access to services,
- 3 adding a description of homeless youth, and expanding the ages
- 4 that may be served for the safe spaces for youth pilot program.
- 5 SECTION 2. Act 130, Session Laws of Hawaii 2022, is
- 6 amended by amending section 2 to read as follows:
- 7 "SECTION 2. (a) There is established within the
- 8 department of human services [for administrative purposes only
- 9 a] office of youth services the safe spaces for youth pilot
- 10 program, which shall be an inter-agency initiative to provide
- 11 safe spaces in each county for youth experiencing
- 12 homelessness [-] or who are at risk of homelessness.
- (b) [The program shall collaborate with all] All
- 14 departments of the State and its political subdivisions that
- 15 offer services [for the purpose of ensuring] for the well-being
- 16 of youth in Hawaii, including the department of education,
- 17 department of health, department of human services, department

- 1 of public safety, and county police departments, shall
- 2 collaborate to [coordinate the identification of] identify youth
- 3 who are experiencing homelessness and coordinate placement of
- 4 these youth at a shelter for homeless youth.
- 5 (c) The department of human services shall enter into
- **6** contracts with nonprofit organizations to provide [shelters]
- 7 shelter, assessment, and access to available services for
- 8 [homeless] youth[\div] experiencing homelessness or who are at risk
- 9 of homelessness. Any nonprofit organization contracted under
- 10 this subsection shall have the knowledge, experience, and
- 11 qualifications, including licenses, necessary to operate a
- 12 shelter for homeless youth.
- 13 (d) Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, a
- 14 shelter for homeless youth contracted under subsection (c) may
- 15 admit a youth into the shelter's care for up to ninety days
- 16 without the consent of the youth's parent or guardian. Shelters
- 17 for homeless youth shall take steps to ensure that youth who are
- 18 or should be under the legal jurisdiction of the juvenile
- 19 justice or child welfare systems obtain and receive services
- 20 from those systems until such time as the youth are released
- 21 from the jurisdiction of the juvenile justice or child welfare

- 1 systems as required by the Runaway and Homeless Youth Act, title
- 2 42 United States Code sections 5701 through 5752, as amended."
- 3 (e) The department of human services shall submit a report
- 4 of its findings and recommendations pertaining to the safe
- 5 spaces for youth pilot program to the legislature no later than
- 6 thirty days prior to the convening of the regular session of
- 7 2025. The report shall include:
- 8 (1) A record of pilot program activities and
- 9 accomplishments;
- 10 (2) A recommendation on whether to extend the program; and
- 11 (3) Any proposed legislation.
- 12 (f) The department of human services [shall] may adopt
- 13 rules pursuant to chapter 91, Hawaii Revised Statutes, necessary
- 14 to carry out the purposes of this Act.
- 15 (g) For the purposes of this Act:
- 16 "Shelter for homeless youth" means a facility that operates
- 17 to receive youth twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week, and
- 18 provide youth with services, [including:] that may include:
- 19 (1) Overnight lodging and supervision;
- 20 (2) Hot meals and hot showers;
- 21 (3) Access to medical and behavioral health services; and

11		other health care or behavioral health care settings;
12	(2)	Youth who have a primary nighttime residence that is a
13		public or private place not designed for or ordinarily
14		used as a regular sleeping accommodation for human
15		beings; or
16	(3)	Youth who are living in cars, parks, public spaces,
17		abandoned buildings, substandard housing, bus or train
18		stations, or similar settings."
19	SECT	ION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
20	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$4,496,870 or so much	
21	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal years 2023-2024 and the	

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- 1 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 2 2024-2025 to fund and operate the safe spaces for youth pilot
- 3 program, including funding for two full-time equivalent (2.0
- 4 FTE) positions and administrative costs for the pilot program.
- 5 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 6 of human services for the purposes of this Act.
- 7 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 8 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 9 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2023.
