### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SCHOOL MEALS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 302A-404, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 amended to read as follows: 2 3 "§302A-404 School meals[-]; free school breakfast and 4 lunch. (a) School meals shall be made available under the 5 school meals program in every school where the students are 6 required to eat meals at school. 7 (b) Beginning with the 2024-2025 school year, free school 8 breakfast shall be provided to every student enrolled in a 9 department school who: 10 (1) Qualifies based on the student's household eligibility 11 for reduced price breakfast under the federal school 12 breakfast program or any other federal program for 13 free and reduced price school meals; 14 (2) Submits an application to the department; and 15 Has their application approved by the department. (3)

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1 [<del>(c)</del>] (e) The department may adopt rules or policies 2 governing the collection of funds for student meal accounts with 3 a negative fund balance; provided that no rule or policy shall 4 prohibit feeding a student as required pursuant to subsection 5 (b). 6 (f) It is the intent of this section not to jeopardize the receipt of any federal aid and to the extent, and only to the 7 8 extent necessary to effectuate this intent, the governor may 9 modify the strict provisions of this section, but shall promptly 10 report any such modification with the governor's reasons 11 therefor to the next succeeding session of the legislature for review." 12 13 SECTION 2. Section 302A-405, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 14 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 15 "(a) [The] Except as provided in section 302A-404(b) and 16 (c), the price for school meals shall be set by the department 17 to ensure that moneys received from the sale of the meals shall 18 be [not] no less than one-half of the cost of preparing the 19 meals. The prices for school meals may be adjusted annually 20 based on the previous year's costs rounded to the nearest five 21 cents; provided that the department by rule shall provide a

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2 need." 3 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 4 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for 5 6 the total plate costs associated with providing free school 7 breakfasts and lunches in department of education schools as required by this Act after federal funding has been accounted. 8 9 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 10 education for the purposes of this Act. 11 SECTION 4. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of 12 the Hawaii State Constitution and sections 37-91 and 37-93, 13 Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined that the 14 appropriations contained in H.B. No. , will cause the state 15 general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be 16 exceeded by \$ per cent. In addition, the or 17 appropriation contained in this Act will cause the general fund 18 expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be further 19 exceeded by \$ per cent. The combined total or 20 amount of general fund appropriations contained in only these 21 two Acts will cause the state general fund expenditure ceiling
