- 1 SECTION 1. Section 26-14.8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "[+]\$26-14.8[+] Department of law enforcement. (a) The
- 4 department of law enforcement shall be headed by a single
- 5 executive to be known as the director of law enforcement.
- 6 (b) The director of law enforcement shall appoint, without
- 7 regard to chapter 76, two deputy directors to serve at the
- 8 director's pleasure. Unless otherwise assigned by the director,
- 9 one deputy director shall oversee the law enforcement programs
- 10 of the department of law enforcement and one deputy director
- 11 shall oversee administration of the department of law
- 12 enforcement.
- 13 (c) The department of law enforcement shall be responsible
- 14 for the formulation and implementation of state policies and
- 15 objectives for security, law enforcement, and public safety
- 16 programs and functions, for the service of process, and for the
- 17 security of state buildings and state land.
