# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ROSE-RINGED PARAKEETS.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the rose-ringed
- 2 parakeet is an invasive bird that adversely affects agricultural
- 3 production on Kauai and Oahu. Rose-ringed parakeets are
- 4 herbivores that feed mainly on fruits and grains, such as
- 5 lychee, mango, papaya, longan, corn, and other citrus products.
- 6 Their large flocks and voracious appetites cause damage to
- 7 valuable food crops.
- 8 The legislature further finds that rose-ringed parakeets
- 9 harm native ecosystems by spreading invasive seeds, displacing
- 10 native birds, and spreading avian disease. Their roosting
- 11 behavior, loud calls, and accumulated droppings are detrimental
- 12 to local communities and resort destinations.
- 13 The legislature also finds that in 2021, the population of
- 14 rose-ringed parakeets on Kauai was twelve thousand five hundred,
- 15 with projections for exponential growth in their numbers.
- 16 The legislature additionally finds that based on studies
- 17 completed by the United States Department of Agriculture's



- 1 National Wildlife Research Center in 2023, roost culling is the
- 2 most effective method to remove large numbers of rose-ringed
- 3 parakeets. Since 2020, the county of Kauai has periodically
- 4 culled rose-ringed parakeets successfully at known roosting
- 5 areas.
- 6 Furthermore, the legislature finds that a sustained,
- 7 year-long pilot program to reduce the population of rose-ringed
- 8 parakeets by roost culling is needed to provide relief to Kauai
- 9 and Oahu farmers, enhance visitor destinations, and reduce
- 10 public-health concerns. The Kauai rose-ringed parakeet working
- 11 group will take the research conducted to implement culling
- 12 outside of nesting season, use thermal imaging to reduce roost
- 13 abandonment, and implement a new web-based survey that includes
- 14 a mapping component so that community members can report their
- 15 observations of rose-ringed parakeets.
- 16 Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds
- 17 to establish a one-year pilot program to reduce the population
- 18 of rose-ringed parakeets on Kauai and Oahu using past research
- 19 and on-the-ground experience to guide future strategies.
- 20 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 21 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so

- 1 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for a
- 2 one-year pilot program under the native resources and fire
- 3 protection program (LNR402) to reduce the population of invasive
- 4 rose-ringed parakeets on Kauai and Oahu using past research and
- 5 on-the-ground experience to guide future strategies.
- 6 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 7 land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.
- 8 SECTION 3. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of
- 9 the Hawaii State Constitution and sections 37-91 and 37-93,
- 10 Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined that the
- 11 appropriations contained in H.B. No. , will cause the state
- 12 general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be
- 13 exceeded by \$ or per cent. In addition, the
- 14 appropriation contained in this Act will cause the general fund
- 15 expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be further
- 16 exceeded by \$ or per cent. The combined total
- 17 amount of general fund appropriations contained in only these
- 18 two Acts will cause the state general fund expenditure ceiling
- 19 for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be exceeded by
- 20 \$ or per cent. The reasons for exceeding the
- 21 general fund expenditure ceiling are that:
