A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INFRASTRUCTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that dams and reservoirs 2 form a critical part of Hawaii's infrastructure, providing 3 numerous benefits upon which the State's communities depend. In 4 addition to storing and delivering a reliable source of water 5 for agriculture, assisting with flood control during large storms, mitigating erosion, reducing sediment runoff to 6 7 nearshore ocean reefs, and storing drinking water, dams and 8 reservoirs play a crucial and often overlooked role--providing 9 water for fire suppression.

10 The legislature further finds that the continued 11 availability and operation of dams and reservoirs are extremely 12 important for food and water sustainability and public health 13 and safety. By capturing storm water that would otherwise rush 14 to the ocean, reservoirs help recharge the State's groundwater 15 aquifers, which are a primary source for much of Hawaii's 16 drinking water. Providing renewable energy through the use of

hydropower is also another significant community benefit derived
 from dams and reservoirs.

3 The purpose of this Act is to establish a dam and reservoir
4 working group to ensure and enhance the continued availability
5 and safe operation of dams and reservoirs in the State.

6 SECTION 2. (a) There is established a dam and reservoir
7 working group, to be placed within the office of planning and
8 sustainable development for administrative purposes only.

9 (b) The dam and reservoir working group shall consist of10 the following members:

11 (1) The director of the office of planning and sustainable 12 development or the director's designee, who shall serve as co-chairperson of the working group; 13 14 (2) The chairperson of the board of land and natural 15 resources or the chairperson's designee, who shall 16 serve as co-chairperson of the working group; 17 The chairperson of the board of agriculture or the (3) 18 chairperson's designee;

the fiscal biennium for which the appropriation is made;
 provided further that all moneys from the appropriation that are
 unencumbered as of June 30, 2026, shall lapse as of that date.
 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the office of
 planning and sustainable development for the purposes of this
 Act.

7 SECTION 4. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of 8 the Hawaii State Constitution and sections 37-91 and 37-93, 9 Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined that the 10 appropriations contained in H.B. No. , will cause the state 11 general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be exceeded by \$ 12 or per cent. In addition, the 13 appropriation contained in this Act will cause the general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be further 14 15 exceeded by \$ per cent. The combined total or 16 amount of general fund appropriations contained in only these 17 two Acts will cause the state general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be exceeded by 18 per cent. The reasons for exceeding the 19 \$ or
