A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FUNDING ADJUSTMENTS FOR STATE PROGRAMS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. This Act is recommended by the governor for
2	immediate passage in accordance with section 9 of article VII of
3	the Constitution of the State of Hawaii.
4	SECTION 2. In prior years, the respective budget acts
5	contained a budget proviso such as section 72 of Act 88, Session
6	Laws of Hawaii 2021, the General Appropriations Act of 2021 (Act
7	88), which permitted departments to transfer funds between their
8	programs provided that the legislature was informed of the
9	transfers. However, section 8 of Act 248, Session Laws of
10	Hawaii 2022, the Supplemental Appropriations Act of 2022,
11	repealed section 72 of Act 88, and Act 164, Session Laws of
12	Hawaii 2023, the General Appropriations Act of 2023, does not
13	reinstate the proviso. Consequently, although funds were
14	appropriated to various state departments for their operating
15	programs for fiscal year 2023-2024, the proviso's elimination
16	has caused a critical funding emergency by limiting the ability
17	of departments to transfer funds between their programs to
18	address changing conditions.

The department of transportation is requesting the transfer											
of special funds to replace one of its two existing barrier											
transfer machines that provides high occupancy vehicle lanes											
during the morning rush hour on Oahu. The purchase requires the											
transfer of \$3,952,250 from the highways administration program											
that are not necessary for debt service requirements. These											
program savings would be transferred to the Oahu highways											
program for the purchase of the replacement barrier transfer											
machine.											
The purpose of this Act is to address the omission of the											
transfer proviso by appropriating additional special funds as											
emergency appropriations for fiscal year 2023-2024 for operating											
shortfalls in quarter 3 funding for existing programs and to											
adjust funding for various programs to be commensurate with											
their anticipated levels of activity. The emergency											
appropriation and the funding adjustment made in this Act are											
budget neutral.											
SECTION 3. Act 164, Session Laws of Hawaii 2023, is											
amended by amending section 3 as follows:

Description:

Appropriates special funds to Department of Transportation programs to pay for anticipated operating shortfalls due to the limited ability to transfer funds between programs.

JUSTIFICATION SHEET

DEPARTMENT:

Budget and Finance

TITLE:

A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO FUNDING ADJUSTMENTS FOR STATE PROGRAMS.

PURPOSE:

To increase a special fund appropriation to the Department of Transportation (DOT) to meet operating budget shortfalls and make a corresponding special fund reduction to offset the aforementioned addition due to the limited ability to transfer funds between programs within the same department.

MEANS:

Amend items C-27 and C-31 of section 3 of Act 164, Session Laws of Hawaii (SLH) 2023.

JUSTIFICATION:

Act 164, SLH 2023, did not contain boilerplate provisions that are generally included in the General Appropriations Act that provide the Governor with authority to transfer funds for operating purposes. This authority was previously used by the Governor to address program shortfalls within departments. Because this authority was removed, some programs face operating budget shortfalls.

DOT is requesting a transfer of special funds to replace one of its two existing barrier transfer machines (BTM) (also known as the Zipper Mobile) that provide High Occupancy Vehicle lanes during the morning rush hour on Oahu. The purchase would require the transfer of \$3,952,250 from the TRN 595/DB Highways Administration program that are not necessary for debt service requirements. These program savings are to be transferred to the TRN 501/DC Oahu Highways program for the purchase of the replacement BTM.

The transfer proposed in this bill is a budget-neutral transfer of special funds and will not impact the general fund fiscal year 2023-2024 expenditure ceiling.

Impact on the public: This bill provides a way for DOT to address operating budget shortfalls due to the limited ability to transfer funds. This will ensure continued departmental services and operations which serve the public good.

Impact on the department and other agencies: This bill will benefit DOT by allowing it to meet operating shortfalls.
