A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE SCHOOL FACILITIES SPECIAL FUND.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. This Act is recommended by the governor for				
2	immediate passage in accordance with section 9 of article VII of				
3	the Constitution of the State of Hawaii.				
4	SECTION 2. Act 257, Session Laws of Hawaii 2022, as				
5	amended by Act 175, Session Laws of Hawaii 2023, is amended as				
6	follows:				
7	1. By adding a new section to read as follows:				
8	"SECTION 1A. The director of finance is authorized to				
9	issue general obligation bonds in the sum of \$ or so				
10	much thereof as may be necessary and the same sum or so much				
11	thereof as may be necessary is appropriated for fiscal year				
12	2023-2024 for deposit into the school facilities special fund.				
13	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the school				
14	facilities authority for the purposes of this Act; provided that				
15	the appropriation authorized by this Act shall not lapse at the				
16	end of the fiscal biennium for which the appropriation is made;

19	to eligible children of the State. The school facilities			
20	authority may expend the moneys appropriated in this section on:			
21	(1) The construction of new school facilities;
